DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

An act to extend medical assistance eligibility for persons who lose eligibility for aid to families with dependent children due to employment; and providing an effective date.

ASSUMPTIONS:

- Fifty additional AFDC cases will qualify for extended medical benefits each month due to employment 1. beginning April of 1990 and will peak in November of 1990.
- The additional cost for each case receiving extended medical benefits will be \$346 per month. 2.
- The federal medicaid matching rate is 71.17% in FY90 and 71.28% in FY91. 3.
