4 A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT TO SUBMIT TO THE
5 QUALIFIED ELECTORS OF MONTANA AN AMENDMENT TO ARTICLE V,
6 SECTION 3, OF THE MONTANA CONSTITUTION TO PROVIDE THAT A
7 MEMBER OF THE LEGISLATURE MAY NOT SERVE MORE THAN 8
8 CONSECUTIVE YEARS IN THE LEGISLATURE; AND PROVIDING AN
9 EFFECTIVE DATE AND AN APPLICABILITY DATE."

11 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

12 **Section 1.** Article V, section 3, of The Constitution
13 of the State of Montana is amended to read:14 "Section 3. Election and terms. (1) A member of the
15 house of representatives shall be elected for a term of two
16 years and a member of the senate for a term of four years
17 each to begin on a date provided by law. One-half of the
18 senators shall be elected every two years.19 (2) No senator or representative may serve more than 8
20 consecutive years in the legislature."21 **NEW SECTION. Section 2.** Effective date --
22 applicability. If approved by the electorate, this amendment
23 is effective September 1, 1991, and applies to legislators
24 elected at elections commencing with the general election
25 held in November 1990.

1 **NEW SECTION. Section 3.** Submission to electorate.
2 This amendment shall be submitted to the qualified electors
3 of Montana at the general election to be held November 6,
4 1990, by printing on the ballot the full title of this act
5 and the following:
6 ☐ FOR limiting members of the legislature to serving
7 no more than 8 consecutive years in the legislature.
8 ☐ AGAINST limiting members of the legislature to
9 serving no more than 8 consecutive years in the
10 legislature.
