14 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:
15 **Section 1.** Section 75-10-534, MCA, is amended to read:
16 "75-10-534. Department to pay approved county budget.
17 (1) The department shall pay to a county the amount of the
18 approved junk vehicle collection and graveyard budget of the
19 county.
20 (2) The yearly payment may not exceed \$1 for each
21 motor--vehicle passenger car and truck under 8,001 pounds
22 gross vehicle weight that is licensed in that county.
23 However,--for--those--counties--that--have except that if a
24 county:
25 (a) has fewer than 5,000 such motor vehicles, the

1 department may pay up to \$5,000, providing the county can
2 justify this payment; and
3 (b) can justify to the department that it needs funds
4 for a special junk vehicle collection project, the
5 department may, if it has sufficient junk vehicle funds,
6 grant the county additional money for such project. The
7 additional grant may be used only for junk vehicle
8 collection."
9 **NEW SECTION. Section 2.** Extension of authority. Any
10 existing authority to make rules on the subject of the
11 provisions of [this act] is extended to the provisions of
12 [this act].
13 **NEW SECTION. Section 3.** Effective date. [This act] is
14 effective July 1, 1989.

STATE OF MONTANA - FISCAL NOTE

In compliance with a written request, there is hereby submitted a Fiscal Note for SB119, as introduced.

DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

This legislation would allow County Junk Vehicle programs to request additional annual funding for special vehicle collection programs such as river cleanups. Funds could also be used to provide additional vehicle collection after the county's annual grant is depleted.

ASSUMPTIONS:

1. Assume County Junk Vehicle programs will request \$25,000 to \$30,000 additional funds per fiscal year. Historically, counties have only spent 85-90% of their annual grants. These remaining unspent funds could be used to fund special collection projects.
2. Assumed the re-registration fee increase legislation contained in HB111 to increase the Junk Vehicle License Registration Fee from \$.50 to \$1.10 will pass.

Will reduce fund balance by \$30,000 per year. Additional revenue should be generated from sale of additional vehicles collected. If sufficient funding is not available in the earmarked junk vehicle account, special collections projects would not be funded. The proposed legislation specifies additional collection funds will be granted if available.

EFFECT ON COUNTY OR LOCAL REVENUE OR EXPENDITURE:

Would allow counties to request additional funds for junk vehicle collection only.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

Section 1. Section 75-10-534, MCA, is amended to read:**"75-10-534. Department to pay approved county budget.**

NEW SECTION. SECTION 3. COORDINATION INSTRUCTION. UNLESS HOUSE BILL NO. 111 [LC 535] IS PASSED AND APPROVED, [THIS ACT] IS VOID.

NEW SECTION. Section 4. Effective date. [This act] is effective July 1, 1989.
