NEW SECTION. Section 1. Surrender of driver's license in lieu of bail -- temporary driving permit. A peace officer authorized to accept bail for the violation involved may, at the request of the violator, take in lieu of bail the driver's license of the person to whom he issues a citation for violation of a provision of Title 61, chapter 3, 7, 8, 9, or 10. The officer shall, when the driver's license is taken, note on the back of the copy of the citation given to the cited person, in a form determined by the department of justice, that the cited person's driver's license was taken in lieu of bail for the cited violation and the date upon which the person shall appear in court. The notice entitles the person to operate a motor vehicle that his driver's license entitles him to operate, with any restrictions and conditions on his driver's license, until the date of his appearance in court.
