In compliance with a written request, there is hereby submitted a Fiscal Note for SB214, as introduced.

DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

An Act removing the law that limits the money available for subsidized adoption; repealing Section 53-4-305, MCA; and providing an immediate effective date.

ASSUMPTIONS:

1. The executive budget request for subsidized adoption in the Department of Family Services budget is adequate to provide an average yearly subsidy of \$2,295 for 87 clients.
2. There are currently about 195 children in the DFS foster care system that have adoption as their objective.
3. DFS policy sets the maximum amount for an adoption subsidy at \$10 less than the corresponding monthly foster care rate.
4. Any increase in subsidized adoption costs due to caseload increase will be absorbed by the current level funding for foster care.
