WITHHOLDING OF LICENSE PRIVILEGE AS A PENALTY FOR PAILURE TO

NOTIFY: AND PROVIDING AN IMMEDIATE EFFECTIVE DATE."

A statement of intent is required for this bill because [section 1] grants to the fish and game commission rulemaking authority to implement the provisions of this bill. At a minimum, the rules are intended to address:

- 17 (1) information considered necessary to monitor elk18 kills and unsuccessful elk hunts;
- 19 (2) the form of the notification card required by
 20 [section 1]; and
- 21 (3) enforcement of the penalty provisions of [section 22 1(3)].
- 24 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:
- 25 NEW SECTION. Section 1. Notification of results of



- elk hunt required -- penalty. (1) In order to enhance recordkeeping, the department shall issue with every elk license a card to be returned to the department by the licensee within 10 days of successfully killing an elk. The card must contain any information the commission by rule determines necessary to monitor elk kills during the season.
 - (2) If a licensee does not successfully kill an elk during the season, the card must be marked to indicate an unsuccessful hunt and returned to the department within 10 days of the end of the season.
- 11 (3) A licensee who fails to return the card as
 12 required by this section may not be issued a license to hunt
 13 elk during the next regular hunting season.
- NEW SECTION. Section 2. Codification instruction.

STATE OF MONTANA - FISCAL NOTE

In compliance with a written request, there is hereby submitted a Fiscal Note for SB236, as introduced.

DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

SB236 would require all elk license holders to return to the Department of Fish, Wildlife and Parks a card containing information considered necessary to monitor elk kills and unsuccessful hunts. **ASSUMPTIONS:**

- Assume 134,000 hunters will purchase elk licenses (19,000 class AAA sportsmen licenses which include 1. an elk license, 98,000 class A-5 elk licenses, and 17,000 big game combination licenses). This is consistent with the current license year.
- The department will order 33,0000 class AAA hunters licenses, 113,000 A-5 elk licenses, and 18,000 2. nonresident big game combination licenses. The order will specify that these licenses include an attached card which will contain information considered necessary to monitor elk kills and unsuccessful elk hunts.
- 3. The department will pay for the return postage on the card.
- The department assumes the enforcement function will have to be on an honor system. The list of all 4. hunters holding elk licenses would have to be provided to the state's 400 general license agents in order to prevent a person from purchasing an elk license from a license agent. There is no practical, cost-effective way to provide the list of names to all license agents.
- The department assumes than on an honor system about 50% of the hunters will return the card. 5.
- 6. A computerized tracking system will monitor the 134,000 hunters who purchase elk licenses as a subsystem of the department's present wildlife survey system.
- The department will survey by telephone the hunters purchasing elk licenses who do not return the 7. cards.
- Implementation would begin with the March 1, 1990, license year and the first return of cards will 8. occur during the 1990 hunting season, which is FY91.
