10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

Section 1. Section 23-5-413, MCA, is amended to read:

"23-5-413. Raffle prizes restricted -- exemption. (1)

Raffle prizes must be in tangible personal property only and not in money, cash, stocks, bonds, evidences of indebtedness, or other intangible personal property and must may not exceed the value of \$1,000 for each individual raffle card. It shall be unlawful to, in any manner, combine any awards so as to increase the ultimate value of such the award.

(2) (a) The restrictions of subsection (1) do not apply to a raffle conducted by a nonprofit corporation, religious corporation sole, or other nonprofit organization when the corporation or organization is licensed by the board of county commissioners to conduct the raffle. A separate license shall be required for each raffle

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- (b) The organization or corporation seeking the license under subsection (2)(a) must apply to the board of county commissioners for the license and must provide the following information:
- 8 (i) the cost and number of raffle tickets to be sold;
- 9 (ii) the charitable purposes the proceeds of the 10 raffle are intended to benefit; and
  - (iii) the proposed prizes and their value.
- 12 (c) A veterans' organization seeking exemption from

  13 the license fee shall present evidence of the organization's

  14 nonprofit status to the board of county commissioners.
  - (e)(d) The proceeds from the sale of the raffle tickets are to be used only for charitable purposes or to pay for prizes. The raffle prize must be in tangible personal property only and not in money, cash, stock, bonds, evidence of indebtedness, or other intangible personal property. None of the proceeds may be used for the administrative cost of conducting the raffle.
  - (d)(e) The corporation or organization conducting the raffle must submit an accounting to the board of county commissioners within 30 days following the completion of the raffle. The person or persons submitting the application to
