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1 2 INTRODUCED BY 12-4 411-5723 for NATHE ations 3 A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT ASSURING LEASEHOLDERS Smith Caster Stilling Bong tom Make RIGHT OF FIRST REFUSAL IN SALE OF CERTAIN RAILROAD 4 5 6 RIGHT-OF-WAY PROPERTY." 7 STATEMENT OF INTENT 8 A statement of intent is required for this bill because 9 [section 3] gives the public service commission authority to 10 11 establish by rule quidelines for resolving disputes. The 12 legislature intends that in making rules the commission conform to existing statutes and to its own rules and that 13 it establish procedures for expeditious resolution of 14 15 disputes. The commission shall provide in the rules for the 16 use of independent appraisers. 17

18 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

19 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Section 1. Definitions. As used in [this 20 act]:

(1) "Fair market value" means the price negotiated
between the parties under [section 2] or the market value of
the property minus the value of any leasehold improvements,
as determined by independent appraisers.

25 (2) "Leaseholder" means a person who holds a lease,

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license, or permit with respect to property within a right-of-way and who has erected leasehold improvements on the property with a total fair market value of \$2,500 or more.

(3) "Railroad interest" means:

6 (a) a railroad corporation or its trustee or successor
7 in interest;

8 (b) a railroad corporation that is in proceedings for
9 bankruptcy under federal law; or

10 (c) a nonrailroad holding corporation that owns a 11 controlling interest in a railroad.

(4) "Right-of-way" means real property, including any
interest in real property, that is or has been owned by a
railroad company as the site or is adjacent to the site of
an existing or former rail line.

NEW SECTION. Section 2. Right of first refusal. A 16 railroad interest that is in bankruptcy proceedings may not 17 sell or offer for sale an interest in real property that is 18 within the right-of-way and a railroad interest that is 19 abandoning a railroad line may not sell or offer for sale an 20 interest within the right-of-way to be abandoned unless it 21 first extends a written offer to sell that interest at fair 22 market value to each person who is a leaseholder with 23 respect to the property. The leaseholder must respond to the 24 offer within 60 days of receipt of the notice, and the 25

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1 railroad interest must negotiate in good faith with an 2 interested leaseholder for a period of 90 days following the 3 leaseholder's response. After the 90-day negotiation period, either party may file a notice of dispute with the 4 5 commission under [section 3]. The property may not be sold to a party other than the leaseholder during the response 6 7 and negotiation periods or while a dispute is pending before the commission. This section does not apply to a sale of an 8 9 entire operating railroad line by one operating railroad to another for the purpose of operating a railroad. 10

11 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Section 3. Commission to resolve 12 disputes. (1) A railroad interest or leaseholder may apply 13 to the commission to resolve a dispute concerning fair 14 market value or other terms arising from negotiations under 15 [section 2]. The commission shall adopt rules containing 16 guidelines to implement [section 2] and this section.

17 (2) The commission's decision may be reviewed in the
18 district court in the county where the property is located.
19 The scope of judicial review is limited to determining if
20 substantial evidence exists to support the commission's
21 decision.

22 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Section 4. Codification instruction. 23 [Sections 1 through 3] are intended to be codified as an 24 integral part of Title 69, chapter 14, and the provisions of 25 Title 69, chapter 14, apply to [sections 1 through 3]. -End-
