In compliance with a written request, there is hereby submitted a Fiscal Note for SB411, as introduced.

DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

An Act increasing the penalty for a violation of the fuel conservation speed limit; allocating a portion of fines collected in a Justice's Court to a special revenue account for use by the Department of Justice; decreasing allocations to certain other funds; and amending Sections 3-10-601 and 61-8-718, MCA.

ASSUMPTIONS:

- 1. Assume there will be 68,000 fuel conservation violations in FY89, but 15% less, or 57,800, in FY90 and FY91 as a result of the increased fine.
- 2. Assume that \$5,000,000 of fines and forfeitures will be collected in FY90 and FY91 according to 3-10-601 under existing law.
