13 NEW SECTION. Section 1. Emergency detainment petition -- detention. (1) If a physician, the department, 14 or a local health officer reasonably believes that a person 15 has communicable tuberculosis and that he is likely to 16 attempt to leave the jurisdiction to avoid a hearing on 17 18 commitment to a hospital, the physician, department, or local health officer shall notify the sheriff of the county 19 in which the person is found, who shall cause the person to 20 be detained in a hospital. At least by the next regular 21 22 business day, the physician, department, or local health 23 officer shall petition for an order from the district court 24 of the county in which the person is found for continued 25 detention of the person and to require examination or

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treatment for tuberculosis pursuant to 50-17-105. The

2 sheriff must serve the summons required by 50-17-106 on the 3 person the same day the petition is filed.

4 (2) Immediately after the petition is filed the court s will decide whether further emergency detention is required and may order continued hospital detention of the person for 6 7 no more than 7 days if it finds that the person is an 8 unacceptable danger to the public health and safety in that 9 probably has communicable tuberculosis and unless he 10 detained will probably leave the jurisdiction to avoid a 11 hearing pursuant to this part.

12 (3) The district court of the county in which the 13 person is found has jurisdiction over the person for the 14 purposes of this section. The district court may, in the 15 interests of justice, order that jurisdiction over further 16 proceedings be transferred to the district court of the 17 county of the person's residence.

18 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Section 2. Extension of authority. Any 19 existing authority to make rules on the subject of the 20 provisions of [this act] is extended to the provisions of 21 [this act].

<u>NEW SECTION.</u> Section 3. Codification instruction.
