4 A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT ALLOWING THE LOTTERY
5 COMMISSION TO PARTICIPATE WITH OTHER STATES IN LOTTERY GAMES
6 WHETHER OR NOT THE STATE HAS A COMMON BORDER WITH MONTANA;
7 AND AMENDING SECTION 23-5-1007, MCA."

9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

10 **Section 1.** Section 23-5-1007, MCA, is amended to read:

11 "23-5-1007. Powers and duties of commission. The
12 commission shall:

13 (1) establish and operate a state lottery and may not
14 become involved in any other gambling or gaming;

15 (2) determine policies for the operation of the state
16 lottery, supervise the director and his staff, and meet with
17 the director at least once every 3 months to make and
18 consider recommendations, set policies, determine types and
19 forms of lottery games to be operated by the state lottery,
20 and transact other necessary business;

21 (3) determine the price of each ticket or chance and
22 the number and size of prizes;

23 (4) provide for the conduct of drawings of winners of
24 lottery games;

25 (5) carry out, with the director, a continuing study of

1 the state lotteries of Montana and other states to make the
2 state lottery more efficient, profitable, and secure from
3 violations of the law;

4 (6) study and may enter into agreements with other
5 lottery states to offer regional lottery games;

6 (7) prepare quarterly and annual reports on all aspects
7 of the operation of the state lottery, including but not
8 limited to types of games, gross revenue, prize money paid,
9 operating expenses, net revenue to the state, contracts with
10 gaming suppliers, and recommendations for changes to this
11 part, and deliver a copy of each report to the governor, the
12 department of administration, the legislative auditor, the
13 president of the senate, the speaker of the house of
14 representatives, and each member of the appropriate
15 committee of each house of the legislature as determined by
16 the president of the senate and the speaker of the house;
17 and

18 (8) adopt rules necessary to carry out this part."

19 NEW SECTION. **Section 2.** Extension of authority. Any
20 existing authority to make rules on the subject of the
21 provisions of [this act] is extended to the provisions of
22 [this act].
