5 A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT TO INCREASE BY 2 6 PERCENT THE MAXIMUM GENERAL FUND BUDGET SCHEDULES FOR 7 ELEMENTARY SCHOOLS AND HIGH SCHOOLS FOR SCHOOL FISCAL YEAR 8 1989-90; TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS TO THE SUPERINTENDENT OF 9 PUBLIC INSTRUCTION FOR STATE EQUALIZATION AID; AMENDING 10 SECTIONS 20-9-316 AND 20-9-317, MCA; AND PROVIDING AN 11 EFFECTIVE DATE."

13 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

Section 1. Section 20-9-316, MCA, is amended to read:
"20-9-316. Elementary school maximum budget schedule
for ±985-86 1989-90. (1) For each elementary school having
an ANB of nine or fewer pupils, the maximum shall-be-\$t97959
is \$20,562 if said the school is approved as an isolated
school.

(2) For schools with an ANB of 10 pupils but less than
18 pupils, the maximum shall--be--\$197959 is \$20,562 plus
\$034-10 \$859.30 per pupil on the basis of the average number
belonging over nine.

24 (3) For schools with an ANB of at least 14 pupils but25 less than 18 pupils that qualify for instructional aide



funding under 20-9-322, the maximum shall-be-\$327714 is
 \$33,702 plus \$034-10 \$859.30 per pupil on the basis of the
 average number belonging over 14.

4 (4) For schools with an ANB of 18 pupils and employing
5 one teacher, the maximum shall-be-\$277466 is \$28,295 plus
6 \$834718 \$859.30 per pupil on the basis of the average number
7 belonging over 18, not to exceed an ANB of 25.

8 (5) For schools with an ANB of 18 pupils and employing
9 two full-time teachers, the maximum shall--be--\$437851 is
10 \$45,176 plus \$522-40 \$538.10 per pupil on the basis of the
11 average number belonging over 18, not to exceed an ANB of
12 50.

13 (6) For schools having an ANB in excess of 40, the
14 maximum, on the basis of the total pupils (ANB) in the
15 district for-elementary-pupils-will-be, is as follows:

16 (a) For a school having an ANB of more than 40 and
17 employing a minimum of three teachers, the maximum of \$1,930
18 shall-be \$1,996 is decreased at the rate of \$1.94 for
19 each additional pupil until the total number (ANB) shall
20 have-reached-a-total-of reaches 100 pupils.

(b) For a school having an ANB of more than 100
pupils, the maximum of \$17825-shall-be \$1,880 is decreased
at the rate of \$1772 \$1.77 for each additional pupil until
the ANB shall-have-reached reaches 300 pupils.

pupils, the maximum shall may not exceed \$17481 \$1,526 for each pupil.

3 (7) The maximum per pupil for all pupils (ANB) and for 4 all elementary schools shall must be computed on the basis 5 of the amount allowed herein in this section on account of 6 the last eligible pupil (ANB). All elementary schools 7 operated within the incorporated limits of a city or town 8 shall must be treated as one school for the purpose of this 9 schedule."

Section 2. Section 20-9-317, MCA, is amended to read:
"20-9-317. High school maximum budget schedule for
±985-86 1989-90. (1) For each high school having an ANB of
24 or fewer pupils, the maximum shall--be--\$ll3,708 is
\$117,142.

15 (2) For a secondary high school having an ANB of more
16 than 24 pupils, the maximum \$4,738-shall of \$4,881 be is
17 decreased at the rate of \$25,84 \$26.62 for each additional
18 pupil until the ANB shall-have-reached-a-total-of reaches 40
19 such pupils.

(3) For a school having an ANB of more than 40 pupils,
the maximum of \$47324-shall \$4,455 be is decreased at the
rate of \$25-84 \$26.62 for each additional pupil until the
ANB shall-have-reached reaches 100 pupils.

24 (4) For a school having an ANB of more than 100
25 pupils, a <u>the</u> maximum of \$27774-shall \$2,858 be is decreased

at the rate of \$4.32 \$4.45 for each additional pupil until
 the ANB shall-have-reached reaches 200 pupils.

3 (5) For a school having an ANB of more than 200
4 pupils, the maximum of \$27342-shall \$2,412 be is decreased
5 by \$2738 \$2.45 for each additional pupil until the ANB shall
6 have-reached reaches 300 pupils.

7 (6) For a school having an ANB of more than 300
8 pupils, the maximum of \$27104-shall \$2,168 be is decreased
9 at the rate of 44 45 cents for each additional pupil until
10 the ANB shall-have-reached reaches 600 pupils.

11 (7) For a school having an ANB over of more than 600 12 pupils, the maximum shall may not exceed \$1,973 \$2,032 per 13 pupil.

14 (8) The maximum per pupil for all pupils (ANB) and for all high schools shall must be computed on the basis of the 15 amount allowed herein in this section on account of the last 16 17 eligible pupil (ANB). All high schools and junior high schools which have been approved and accredited as junior 18 19 high schools, operated within the incorporated limits of a 20 city or town, shall must be treated as one school for the 21 purpose of this schedule."

22 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Section 3. Appropriation. (1) All 23 revenues received under the provisions of 20-9-343 are 24 appropriated to the superintendent of public instruction for 25 the fiscal year ending June 30, 1990, for state equalization

aid for the school fiscal year ending June 30, 1990.
 (2) There is appropriated from the general fund
 \$5,600,000 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1990, to the
 superintendent of public instruction to be used to the
 extent funds appropriated in subsection (1) are insufficient
 to finance the maximum general fund budget schedules for
 public schools, excluding special education.

8 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Section 4. Effective date. [This act] is
9 effective July 1, 1989.
