BILL NO. 1 INTRODUCED BY /Sac 2 BY REQUEST OF THE GOVERNOR 3 4 A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT REQUIRING THE BOARD OF 5 TRUSTEES OF EACH ELEMENTARY AND HIGH SCHOOL DISTRICT TO MAKE 6 7 PUBLIC AN ANNUAL STATISTICAL REPORT; AND PROVIDING A TERMINATION DATE." 8 9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA: 10 NEW SECTION. Section 1. Statistical report. (1) By 11 12 June 20 of each year, the board of trustees of each elementary and high school district in the state shall 13 publish a statistical report containing the following 14 information for each school in the district: 15 (a) average pupil academic performance by grade and 16 17 subject matter;

18 (b) average pupil assessment scores on standardized 19 tests;

(c) teacher and administrator attendance rates; 20

(d) total number of teachers and the ratio of teachers 21 to pupils; 22

(e) total number of administrators and the ratio of 23 administrators to pupils and administrators to teachers; 24 (f) total number of noncertified instructional 25



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employees and the ratio of noncertified instructional 1 2 employees to pupils; 3 (g) number of pupil dropouts; 4 (h) average class size by grade and subject area; 5 (i) average number of years experience of the school's 6 teaching staff; 7 (j) number of teachers assigned to teach outside their я major and minor areas of endorsement; and 9 (k) district general fund spending compared to school 10 districts of comparable enrollment. 11 (2) For the purpose of the report, the term "pupil" 12 does not include a special education student. 13 (3) The board of trustees shall provide copies of the 14 statistical report to the county superintendent of schools 15 and the state superintendent of public instruction. A copy 16 of the report must be available for public review at each 17 school in the district. 18 (4) The statistical report must be written in a manner 19 that is easily understood by the general public. The report may not contain information that reveals the personal 20 21 identity of an individual pupil. 22 (5) The state superintendent of public instruction 23 shall prescribe, prepare, and distribute to each elementary and high school district the forms necessary to complete the 24 25 statistical report.
