Te BILL NO. 10 1 1 2 INTRODUCED BY 2 BY REQUEST OF THE GOVERNOR 3 3 4 4 A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT CREATING THE GOVERNOR'S 5 5 NEW CENTURY TEACHER INCENTIVE PROGRAM FOR PUBLIC ELEMENTARY б 6 7 AND HIGH SCHOOL TEACHERS; DIRECTING THE OFFICE OF PUBLIC 7 8 INSTRUCTION TO PRESCRIBE FORMS; APPROPRIATING FUNDING FOR 8 9 THE PROGRAM; AND PROVIDING AN IMMEDIATE EFFECTIVE DATE." 9 10 10 11 WHEREAS, approximately 10,500 public elementary and 11 12 high school teachers provide essential instruction to 12 elementary and high school pupils throughout the State of 13 13 14 Montana; and 14 15 WHEREAS, because of collective bargaining agreements, 15 tenure statutes, and past practices, incentive pay for 16 16 17 teachers who excel in their profession has not been 17 18 provided; and 18 19 WHEREAS, it is the desire of the Legislature to 19 20 compensate and award excellence in teaching so as to 20 21 recognize excellent teachers and promote excellence in 21 22 Montana's educational system; and 22 WHEREAS, establishment of the Governor's New Century 23 23 Teacher Incentive Program will encourage and promote 24 24 25 excellence in the Montana teaching profession. 25

THEREFORE, the Legislature of the State of Montana finds it beneficial to the future of the state's educational system to establish the Governor's New Century Teacher Incentive Program.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

7 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Section 1. Short title. [Sections 1 8 through 9] may be cited as the "Governor's New Century 9 Teacher Incentive Program".

10 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Section 2. Definitions. As used in 11 [sections 1 through 9], the following definitions apply:

12 (1) "Board" means the local school board of the 13 district that employs a teacher.

14 (2) "Creativity" means the ability to provide 15 instruction through imaginative skills and to effect a 16 measured change in pupil performance and interest in subject 17 materials.

8 (3) "Criteria for selection" means:

(a) a teacher's performance in classroom instruction
and management, close monitoring of pupil performance,
demonstrated instructional leadership, and participation in
cocurricular and extracurricular activities;

(b) marked demonstrative creativity in teaching,
assistance in pupil research, or development of academic and
life skills, regardless of pupil age or condition; and

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(c) overall demonstration of excellence in teaching.
 (4) "Eligible teacher" means a Montana certified
 elementary or high school teacher whose nomination and
 selection has been accepted by the board as a recipient of
 an incentive award.

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6 (5) "Excellence" means outstanding or quality teaching 7 that exceeds and surpasses accepted standards established by 8 the board, a collective bargaining agreement, or other 9 measurement adopted by the board.

10 (6) "Incentive award" means a \$5,000 bonus
11 compensation, less federal and state income tax, paid to an
12 eligible teacher.

13 (7) "Performance" means accomplishments in teaching14 and success in achieving results.

15 NEW SECTION. Section 3. Governor's teacher incentive
program -- recipients. (1) There is a governor's teacher
incentive program administered by the office of budget and
program planning and the office of public instruction.

19 (2) The board shall determine the incentive award20 recipients in accordance with [sections 2 through 9].

NEW SECTION. Section 4. Conditions of awards. Each
 incentive award must be distributed in a manner and under
 terms determined by the office of budget and program
 planning and the office of public instruction.

25 NEW SECTION. Section 5. Nomination and selection

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process. (1) The nomination of a teacher for an incentive
 award must be completed on or before February 1, 1990. The
 nomination must be made by:

4 (a) a majority vote of a school's certified teachers,
5 as provided by board policy;

6 (b) a school principal and district superintendent
7 jointly or, if there is no district principal or
8 superintendent, by the county superintendent of schools;

9 (c) any three parents whose children are currently or 10 were previously enrolled in a classroom of the nominated 11 teacher; or

12 (d) any 10 enrolled pupils of a school district who 13 are currently taught or were previously taught by the 14 nominated teacher.

15 (2) A teacher nominated for an incentive award shall 16 prepare and submit to the district superintendent or, if 17 there is no district superintendent, to the school principal 18 or county superintendent of schools a governor's teacher 19 incentive program application to become an eligible teacher. 20 The application must contain the following:

21 (a) all existing classroom evaluations of the teacher
22 performed in the last 3 years;

(b) peer review forms completed by a teacher selected
by the nominee, a teacher selected by the school principal,
district superintendent, or county superintendent of

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schools, and a teacher selected by the board. If the size of
 a school district does not allow for peer review by another
 teacher, the county superintendent shall prepare and submit
 the peer review form.

5 (c) written comments submitted by pupils and parents 6 or legal guardians and solicited through a general 7 announcement from the school district; and

8 (d) other information directly related to the criteria
9 for selection or indicative of the teacher's performance in
10 the classroom.

(3) A teacher's governor's teacher incentive program
nomination packet must be submitted to the district
superintendent or, if there is no district superintendent,
to the school principal or county superintendent of schools
by March 1, 1990. The nominee's governor's teacher incentive
program packet must be transmitted to a selection panel
composed of the following individuals:

18 (a) a parent selected by the board;

19 (b) the school principal or, if there is no principal,20 the county superintendent of schools;

21 (c) a teacher selected by the school district faculty;
22 and

23 (d) a pupil currently enrolled in the school district
24 and selected by the student council, if there is one, or the
25 board.

1 (4) The selection panel shall use the criteria for 2 selection set forth in [section 2] to determine whether the 3 nominee is eligible for final consideration of the incentive 4 award. The panel shall, no later than April 1, 1990, 5 transmit the names of nominees recommended for receiving 6 incentive awards to the board.

7 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Section 6. Board review of 8 recommendations. The board shall, at the next regular or 9 special board meeting but no later than May 15, 1990, review 10 the selection panel's recommendations and either accept or 11 reject nominations. If the board accepts a recommendation, 12 the nominee becomes an eligible teacher.

NEW SECTION. Section 7. Payment of incentive awards. 13 14 On or before May 30, 1990, the board shall certify an 15 eligible teacher and transmit a list of eligible teachers to 16 the office of public instruction. The office of public 17 instruction shall verify the list and deposit with the 18 county treasurer revenue necessary to pay the incentive 19 awards. On or before June 15, 1990, the board shall pay the 20 incentive award to the eligible teacher.

<u>NEW SECTION.</u> Section 8. Incentive award not salary.
 An eligible teacher may not consider the incentive award as
 salary or compensation for purposes of:

24 (1) a collective bargaining agreement;

25 (2) determining salary; or

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1 (3) adjusting or modifying his retirement.

2 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Section 9. Office of public instruction 3 to prepare and distribute forms. The office of public 4 instruction shall, prior to January 1, 1990, prepare and 5 distribute to all school districts in Montana forms required 6 for the selection of eligible teachers.

NEW SECTION. Section 10. Appropriation. There is
appropriated to the office of public instruction \$5,250,000
for purposes of [sections 1 through 9].

10 NEW SECTION. Section 11. Effective date. [This act]

11 is effective on passage and approval.

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
