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INTRODUCED BY BARDANOUVE

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A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT MAINTAINING LEGISLATORS SALARIES AT THE CURRENT LEVEL FOR THE 53RD LEGISLATURE; AMENDING SECTION 5-2-301, MCA; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE."

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

Section 1. Section 5-2-301, MCA, is amended to read:

- *5-2-301. Compensation and expenses for members while in session. (1) Except as provided in subsection (7), legislators are entitled to a salary commensurate to that of the daily rate of an entry grade 8 classified state employee in effect when the regular session of the legislature prior to the regular session in which they serve is was convened under 5-2-103 for those days during which the legislature is in session. The president of the senate and the speaker of the house shall receive an additional \$5 a day in salary for those days during which the legislature is in session.
 - (2) Legislators may serve for no salary.
- (3) Legislators are entitled to \$50 a day, 7 days a week, during a legislative session, as reimbursement for expenses incurred in attending a session. Expense payments shall stop when the legislature recesses for more than 3

- days and shall resume when the legislature reconvenes.
- 2 (4) Legislators are entitled to a mileage allowance as 3 provided in 2-18-503 for each mile of travel to the place of 4 the holding of the session and to return to their place of 5 residence at the conclusion of the session.
- 6 (5) In addition to the mileage allowance provided for
 7 in subsection (4), legislators, upon submittal of an
 8 appropriate claim for such mileage reimbursement to the
 9 office of the legislative council, are entitled to:
- 10 (a) three additional round trips to their place of 11 residence during each regular session; and
 - (b) such additional round trips as are authorized by the legislature during special session.
- 14 (6) Legislators are not entitled to any additional 15 mileage allowance under subsection (4) for a special session 16 if it is convened within 7 days of a regular session.
 - (1) and the expense allowance provided for in subsection (3), a legislator may receive remuneration for services performed during a legislative session. A legislator

choosing to receive remuneration for services performed

(7) In lieu of the salary provided for in subsection

- 22 shall file a request to receive payment under this
