An act temporarily prohibiting travel by state officers and employees that is not essential to the operation of the agency; and providing an immediate effective date.

ASSUMPTIONS:

- 1. FY91 totals for in-state and out-of-state travel reflect FY93.
- 30% of all travel costs are paid from the general fund.
- The legislation would not become law until the end of July, 1992 and would apply for only four months.

TECHNICAL NOTES:

The estimate may be too high if agencies have already trimmed their travel budgets due to the current fiscal constraints in FY92 and FY93.
