NEW SECTION. Section 1. Moratorium certain interstate transport of hazardous waste or hazardous waste-derived fuel. (1) The state of Montana recognizes the importance of providing for disposal or incineration of hazardous waste or for the use of hazardous waste-derived fuel in a manner that protects Montana's public health, safety, welfare, and environment. Although the state of Montana recognizes that, under appropriate conditions, the transportation of out-of-state hazardous waste or hazardous waste-derived fuel into Montana may not conflict with this goal, it is imperative that the state further develop regional and statewide hazardous waste management goals, plans, and regulations and revise its rules governing hazardous waste facility siting and operation criteria before allowing hazardous waste or hazardous waste-derived l fuel importation.
