SECTION 26. SECTION 53-30-101, MCA. IS AMENDED TO READ:

"53-30-101. Location and function of prison and women's
 correctional center. (1) The institution at Deer Lodge is the state
 prison and as its primary function provides facilities for the

custody, treatment, training, and rehabilitation of adult male
 criminal offenders.

3 (2) The institution located in accordance with sections 1 through 7, Chapter 651, Laws of 1991, is the women's correctional 4 5 center and as its primary function provides facilities for the custody, treatment, training, and rehabilitation of adult female 6 criminal offenders. If the authorized institution does not require 7 the level of services provided for in Chapter 651, Laws of 1991, an 8 alternate site in the Billings area may be identified by department 9 officials, city of Billings officials, and Yellowstone County 10 officials as the site of the women's correctional facility." 11

NEW SECTION. Section 27. Severability. If a part of [this act] is invalid, all valid parts that are severable from the invalid part remain in effect. If a part of [this act] is invalid in one or more of its applications, the part remains in effect in all valid applications that are severable from the invalid applications.
