BY REQUEST OF THE MONTANA ARTS COUNCIL

A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT ESTABLISHING PRIORITIES FOR CULTURAL AND AESTHETIC PROJECT GRANT AWARDS; AND APPROPRIATING MONEY FOR CULTURAL AND AESTHETIC PROJECT GRANTS."

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

NEW SECTION. **Section 1. Appropriation of cultural and aesthetic grant funds -- priority of disbursement.** (1) The Montana arts council shall award grants for projects authorized by and limited to the amounts appropriated by this section. Money must be disbursed in priority order, first to projects covered under subsection (2), and second to projects listed in subsection (3). The Montana arts council shall disburse money to projects authorized by this section through grant contracts between the Montana arts council and the grant recipient. The award contract binds the parties to conditions, if any, listed with the appropriation in subsection (3).

(2) If the money in the cultural and aesthetic projects account is insufficient in the biennium ending June 30, 1993, to fund projects in the amount for which they were approved, the approved amount for the projects is reappropriated from the account

1 until money has been disbursed to fully cover appropriations or
 2 until October 1, 1994, whichever comes first.
