JOHNSON 2 2 3 3 A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT REVISING THE CRITERIA 4 4 FOR THE DISMISSAL OF A TEACHER UNDER CONTRACT; AND AMENDING 5 5 SECTION 20-4-207, MCA." 6 6 7 7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA: 8 8 9 Section 1. Section 20-4-207, MCA, is amended to read: 9 10 "20-4-207. Dismissal of teacher under contract. (1) The 10 11 trustees of any a district may dismiss a teacher before the 11 12 12 expiration of his the teacher's employment contract for 13 13 immorality, unfitness, incompetence instructional 14 ineffectiveness, or violation of the adopted policies of 14 15 15 such the trustees. 16 (2) (a) The following persons may recommend the 16 17 dismissal of a teacher for cause under subsection (1): 17 18 (i) a district superintendent; 18 19 (ii) in a district without a district superintendent, a 19 20 20 principal; or 21 21 (iii) in a district without a district superintendent or 22 a principal, the county superintendent or a trustee of the 22 23 23 district. 24 (b) A person listed in subsection (2)(a) who recommends 24 25 dismissal of a teacher shall give notice of the 25



recommendation in writing to each trustee of the district and to the teacher.

3 (c) The notice must state the specific instances of
4 behavior or acts that led to the recommendation for
5 dismissal.

6 (3) (a) Whenever the trustees of any district receive a 7 recommendation for dismissal, the trustees shall notify the 8 teacher of his <u>the</u> right to a hearing before the trustees, 9 either by certified letter or by personal notification for 0 which a signed receipt must be returned. The teacher may in 1 writing waive the right to a hearing. Unless the teacher 2 waives the right to a hearing, the teacher and trustees 3 shall agree on a hearing date not less than 5 days or more 4 than 20 days from the notice of intent to recommend 5 dismissal.

16 (b) The trustees shall conduct a hearing on the 17 recommendation and resolve at the conclusion of the hearing 18 to dismiss the teacher or to reject the recommendation for 19 dismissal.

(4) With the exception of a county superintendent, a person who recommends dismissal pursuant to subsection (2) may suspend the teacher from active performance of duty with pay pending the hearing date if the teacher's behavior or acts that led to the recommendation for dismissal are contrary to the welfare of the students or the effective

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1 operation of the school district.

2 (5) Any A teacher who has been dismissed may in writing 3 within 10 days appeal such the dismissal to the county 4 superintendent. Following such the appeal, a hearing must be scheduled within 10 days and held within 30 days after the 5 6 appeal, except that the period may be extended upon 7 agreement between the teacher and the trustees. If the 8 county superintendent, after a hearing, determines that the 9 dismissal by the trustees was made without good cause, he 10 the superintendent shall order the trustees to reinstate 11 such the teacher and to compensate such the teacher at his 12 the contract amount for the time lost during the pending of 13 the appeal."

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
