# STATE OF MONTANA - FISCAL NOTE

Form BD-15

In compliance with a written request, there is hereby submitted a Fiscal Note for HB0099, as introduced.

### DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

A bill to provide for general revision to data processing statutes 2-17-501, and 502 which clarifies and generally increases the authority the department of administration has over computer hardware and software purchases by state agencies.

#### ASSUMPTIONS:

- 1. The Department of Administration, Information Services Division, begins performing the new responsibilities described in the bill beginning July 1, 1993.
- 2. 3 FTE are needed in ISD to implement the bill. These are estimated to be grade 15 computer and telecommunications professionals at a cost of \$28,000 per year plus benefits @20% (\$33,600 per FTE).
- 3. Operating Expenses per FTE per year are estimated at \$5,000.
- 4. Equipment costs in the first year of operation include a PC and office equipment at \$5,000 per FTE.

### LONG-RANGE EFFECTS OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

Statewide savings are inestimable but potentially significant. Greater compatibility of agencies' computer hardware and software with statewide planning objectives and directions can improve the efficiency of the state's information processing infrastructure. Coordination of agency purchases would tend to strengthen the state's purchasing power. Standardization, where appropriate in satisfying user needs, would achieve economies of scale with respect to acquisition and operating costs. Enhancement of strategic planning would better position the state to anticipate rapidly changing technologies.
