A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION TO ENTER INTO AGREEMENTS WITH OTHER GOVERNMENTAL ENTITIES RELATING TO THE TAXATION OF CERTAIN FUELS AND LIMITING THE POWERS THAT THE DEPARTMENT MAY DELEGATE IN THE AGREEMENTS."

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

NEW SECTION. Section 1. Agreements with other governmental entities relating to collection of certain fuel taxes. (1) The department of transportation may enter into agreements relating to the administration and taxation of gasoline, special fuels, and liquefied petroleum gas with state agencies of this state and other states, agencies of the federal government, and agencies of foreign governments and provinces.

(2) The agreements may cover audits, exchange of information, licensure of sellers and users, distribution, and other matters that the department considers necessary for the administration of the taxation of gasoline, special fuels, and liquefied petroleum gas. In an agreement, the department may not delegate powers to another governmental
