INTRODUCEE

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A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT CREATING A BOARD OF DENTURITRY; AMENDING SECTIONS 2-15-1842, 37-29-102, 37-29-304, AND 37-29-404, MCA; AND PROVIDING AN IMMEDIATE

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

Section 1. Section 2-15-1842, MCA, is amended to read:

\*2-15-1842. Board of dentistry. (1) There is a board of dentistry.

whom shall serve as a nonvoting member, one—denturist, one of whom shall serve as a nonvoting member, one—denturist, one dental hygienist, and two public members, one of whom must be a senior citizen. All members are appointed by the governor with the consent of the senate. Each licensed member shall must be licensed to practice as a dentist, denturist, or dental hygienist in this state, shall must have actively practiced in this state for at least 5 continuous years immediately before his-appointment being appointed, except-as-provided-in-subsection-(2)(b), and shall must be actively engaged in practice while serving on the board. Each member shall must be a resident of this state.



ticensed-member-to-have-actively-practiced-in-this-state-for at--least--5--continuous--years--immediately--before---his appointment--does-not-apply-to-the-first-denturist-appointed to-the-board:

- (3) Each member shall serve for a term of 5 years. Each dentist appointed to the board for a statutory 5-year term shall serve the first year of the term as a nonvoting member of the board. The governor may remove a member only for neglect or cause.
  - (4) The governor shall fill any vacancy within 30 days.
- 12 (5) The board is allocated to the department for administrative purposes only as prescribed in 2-15-121."

NEW SECTION. Section 2. Board of denturitry. (1) There is a board of denturitry. The board consists of four members appointed by the governor. The board must be appointed as prescribed in 2-15-124, except that one member does not have to be an attorney. Two members must be denturists who have had, immediately prior to their appointment, at least 3 years' experience in the practice of denturitry and who are not dentists. One member must be a dentist licensed under 37-4-301. One member must represent the general public.

- (2) A member shall hold office for a term of 4 yearsand until a successor is appointed by the governor.

- 3 Section 3. Section 37-29-102, MCA, is amended to read:
- 4 "37-29-102. Definitions. As used in this chapter,
  5 unless the context requires otherwise, the following
  6 definitions apply:
- 7 (1) "Board" means the state board of dentistry 8 denturitry provided for in 2-15-1842 [section 2].
  - (2) "Denture" means any removable full or partial upper or lower prosthetic dental appliance to be worn in the mouth.
- 12 (3) "Denturist" means a person licensed under this 13 chapter to engage in the practice of denturitry.
  - (4) "Department" means the department of commerce provided for in Title 2, chapter 15, part 18.
  - (5) "Immediate denture" means a denture constructed prior to and inserted immediately after extraction of teeth.
    - (6) "Practice of denturitry" means:

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- (a) the making, fitting, constructing, altering, reproducing, or repairing of a denture and furnishing or supplying of a denture directly to a person or advising the use of a denture; or
- 23 (b) the taking or making or the giving of advice, 24 assistance, or facilities respecting the taking or making of 25 any impression, bite, cast, or design preparatory to or for

- the purpose of making, constructing, fitting, furnishing, supplying, altering, repairing, or reproducing a denture."
- NEW SECTION. Section 4. Officers -- meetings -- voting

  records. (1) The board shall elect a president,

  secretary, and treasurer. The offices of secretary and

  treasurer may be held by one person. The officers must be

  elected for 1-year terms at the annual meeting of the board.
- 8 A person serving as president may not serve consecutive
  9 terms.
- 10 (2) The board shall meet at least twice a year and may
  11 meet at other times as designated by the president or at the
  12 request of two or more board members. Meeting dates and
  13 sites must be set by the board.
- 14 (3) A majority of the board constitutes a quorum for 15 all purposes, and a majority vote of the members voting 16 constitutes the action of the board.
- 17 (4) The department shall keep a complete record of all
  18 the meetings and proceedings of the board and shall keep a
  19 complete account of money received and disbursed by the
  20 department for the board.
- NEW SECTION. Section 5. Compensation and expenses of board members -- deposit of funds. (1) Each member of the board is entitled to receive compensation and travel expenses as provided in 37-1-133, to be paid from money collected pursuant to 37-29-304.

  2 in a state special revenue account for use by the board to
  3 pay for the expenses of the board, the cost of administering

### DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

The bill creates a Board of Denturitry.

#### **ASSUMPTIONS:**

- 1. There will be four board members attending two one-day meetings per year.
- 2. There will be 13 licensees and 15 complaints per year.
- 5. The fiscal note has two parts: One part for the Board of Dentistry and one part for the proposed Board of Denturists.
- 6. The Board of Dentistry will lose one board member and the related expenses. The existing work load of the board will demand use of the remaining appropriation.
