- 10 Section 1. Section 50-40-204, MCA, is amended to read:
- 11 *50-40-204. Smoke-free buildings -- designated smoking
- 12 areas -- exception. (1) In buildings maintained by the state
- or by a political subdivision, smoking is prohibited in the
- 14 following areas:
- 15 (a) general office space;
- 16 (b) auditoriums, classrooms, and conference rooms;
- 17 (c) elevators;
- 18 (d) corridors, lobbies, restrooms, and stairways,
- 19 except as provided in subsections (2)(b) and (4);
- 20 (e) medical care facilities;
- 21 (f) libraries: and
- 22 (g) hazardous areas.
- 23 (2) An agency head or the governing body of a political
- 24 subdivision shall establish at least one "designated smoking
- 25 area" in each building, except in those areas listed in

- subsection (1), suited by architectural design and functional purpose to be used as a smoking area.
- 3 (a) An agency head or the governing body of a political
- 4 <u>subdivision</u> may designate a smoking area in a cafeteria. The
- 5 size of the area must be determined by an estimate of the
- 6 number of smoking and nonsmoking patrons served.

- 9 a smoking area when it is not possible to designate another

- 11 (3) In establishing designated smoking areas, a
