A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT ALLOWING PRIVATE ENGINEERS OR ENGINEERS EMPLOYED BY THE DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES AND CONSERVATION TO INSPECT HIGH-HAZARD DAMS; REQUIRING THE DEPARTMENT TO RECOVER THE FULL COSTS OF INSPECTIONS CONDUCTED BY DEPARTMENT ENGINEERS; AND AMENDING SECTION 85-15-213, MCA."

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

Section 1. Section 85-15-213, MCA, is amended to read:

*85-15-213. Periodic inspections after construction.

(1) Any high-hazard dam, whether or not previously permitted by the department, must be inspected as often as considered necessary by the department, but at least once every 5 years, in order to ensure the continued safe operation of the dam.

(2) Periodic inspections required by this section must be performed by a qualified <u>private engineer or department</u> engineer, who shall make a report of the inspection to the department. If the department finds that the dam conforms to current safety standards, it shall issue or reissue,—as—the ease—may—be; a permit to continue operation of the dam; containing—such. The permit must contain conditions on the

- 2 considers necessary. The department shall recover from the
- 3 dam owner the full costs for an inspection completed by a
- 4 department engineer under this section, as provided by rules
- 5 adopted pursuant to 85-15-110(6).

In compliance with a written request, there is hereby submitted a Fiscal Note for HB0192, as introduced.

<u>DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION</u>: This bill would allow private engineers or engineers employed by the Department of Natural Resources and Conservation to inspect high-hazard dams, and also would require the department to recover the full costs of inspections conducted by department engineers.

ASSUMPTIONS:

- 1. The DNRC could refuse to do inspections prohibited by time or other constraints.
- 2. This bill does not change the number of inspections to be performed.
- 3. The DNRC would incur expenses associated with dam inspections and would recover, from the owner, the full costs of the inspections.
