4 A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT PROVIDING THAT THE  
5 RESIGNATION OF A TRUSTEE OF A SCHOOL DISTRICT MUST BE  
6 SUBMITTED TO THE CLERK OF THE SCHOOL DISTRICT; AND AMENDING  
7 SECTION 2-16-502, MCA."

9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

10 **Section 1.** Section 2-16-502, MCA, is amended to read:

11 "2-16-502. Resignations. (1) Resignations must be in  
12 writing and made as follows:

13 (a) by the governor and lieutenant governor, to the  
14 legislature if it is in session and, if not, then to the  
15 secretary of state;

16 (b) by all officers commissioned by the governor, to  
17 the governor;

18 (c) by senators and members of the house of  
19 representatives, if the legislature is not in session, to  
20 the secretary of state and, if it is in session, to the  
21 presiding officer of the branch to which the member belongs,  
22 who must immediately transmit the same to the secretary of  
23 state;

24 (d) by all county and township officers not  
25 commissioned by the governor, to the clerk of the board of

1 commissioners of their respective counties;

2 (e) by all other appointed officers, to the body or  
3 officer that appointed them;

4 (f) by all trustees of school districts, to the clerk  
5 of the respective school district provided for in 20-3-325;

6 (g) in all cases not otherwise provided for, by filing  
7 the resignation in the office of the secretary of state.

8 (2) A resignation is effective 72 hours after its  
9 submission in the manner provided for in subsection (1)  
10 unless the resignation is withdrawn during that 72-hour  
11 period by the resigner through written notification of  
12 withdrawal made in the same manner as provided in subsection  
13 (1) for resignations."

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(b) by all officers commissioned by the governor, to the governor;

(c) by senators and members of the house of representatives, if the legislature is not in session, to the secretary of state and, if it is in session, to the presiding officer of the branch to which the member belongs, who must immediately transmit the same to the secretary of state;

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(2) A resignation is effective 72 hours after its submission in the manner provided for in subsection (1) unless the resignation is withdrawn during that 72-hour period by the resigner through written notification of withdrawal made in the same manner as provided in subsection (1) for resignations."
