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1 Manton Lunch INTRODUCED BY 2 A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT GIVING A RESIDENT OF A 4 LONG-TERM CARE FACILITY THE RIGHT TO CHOOSE A PHARMACY: AND 5 AMENDING SECTION 50-5-1104, MCA." 6

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

Section 1. Section 50-5-1104, MCA, is amended to read: 9 10 "50-5-1104. Rights of long-term care facility 11 residents. (1) The state adopts by reference for all 12 long-term care facilities the rights for long-term care 13 facility residents applied by the federal government to 14 facilities that provide skilled nursing care or intermediate 15 nursing care and participate in a medicaid or medicare program (42 U.S.C. 1395x(j) and 1396d(c), as implemented by 16 17 regulation).

18 (2) In addition to the rights adopted under subsection
19 (1), the state adopts for all residents of long-term care
20 facilities the following rights:

(a) A resident or his <u>the resident's</u> authorized representative must be informed by the facility at least 30 days in advance of any changes in the cost or availability of services, unless to do so is beyond the facility's control. (b) Regardless of the source of payment, each resident
 or his the resident's authorized representative is entitled,
 upon request, to receive and examine an explanation of his
 the resident's monthly bill.

5 (c) Residents have the right to organize, maintain, and 6 participate in resident advisory councils. The facility 7 shall afford reasonable privacy and facility space for the 8 meetings of the councils.

9 (d) A resident has the right to present a grievance on 10 his the resident's own behalf or that of others to the 11 facility or the resident advisory council. The facility 12 shall establish written procedures for receiving, handling, 13 and informing residents or the resident advisory council of 14 the outcome of any grievance presented.

15 (e) A resident has the right to ask a state agency or a
16 resident advocate for assistance in resolving grievances,
17 free from restraint, interference, or reprisal.

(f) During his <u>a resident's</u> stay in a long-term care
facility, a resident retains the prerogative to exercise
decisionmaking rights in all aspects of his health care,
including placement and treatment issues such as medication,
special diets, or other medical regimens.

23 (g) The resident's authorized representative must be
24 notified in a prompt manner of any significant accident,
25 unexplained absence, or significant change in the resident's

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health status.

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2 (h) A resident has the right to be free from verbal, 3 mental, and physical abuse, neglect, or financial 4 exploitation. Facility staff shall report to the department 5 and the long-term care ombudsman any suspected incidents of 6 abuse under the Montana Elder and Developmentally Disabled 7 Abuse Prevention Act, Title 52, chapter 3, part 8.

8 (i) Each resident has the right to privacy in his the 9 resident's room or portion of the room. If a resident is 10 seeking privacy in his the resident's room, staff members 11 should make reasonable efforts to make their presence known 12 when entering the room.

13 (j) In case of involuntary transfer or discharge, a 14 resident has the right to reasonable advance notice to 15 ensure an orderly transfer or discharge. Reasonable advance 16 notice requires at least 21 days' written notification of 17 any interfacility transfer or discharge except in cases of 18 emergency or for medical reasons documented in the 19 resident's medical record by the attending physician.

20 (k) If clothing is provided to the resident by the21 facility, it must be of reasonable fit.

(1) A resident has the right to reasonable safeguards
for his personal possessions brought to the facility. The
facility shall provide a means for safeguarding the
resident's small items of value in his the resident's room

or in another part of the facility where he the resident
 must have reasonable access to the items.

3 (m) The resident has the right to have all losses or 4 thefts of personal possessions promptly investigated by the 5 facility. The results of the investigation must be reported 6 to the affected resident.

(n) A resident has the right to obtain prescription
drugs or other medicines from a pharmacy of the resident's
choice. A facility may not assess a fee for administering a
prescription drug or other medicine to a resident who has
obtained the drug or medicine from a pharmacy other than the
pharmacy operated by the facility.

13 (3) The administrator of the facility shall adopt 14 whatever additional measures are necessary to implement the 15 residents' rights listed in subsections (1) and (2) and meet 16 any other requirements relating to residents' health and 17 safety that are conditions of participation in a state or 18 federal program of medical assistance."

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
