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House BILL NO. 249 Um E Bishorski 1 INTRODUCED BY 2 3 A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT PROHIBITING MEMBERS OF 4 THE LEGISLATURE WHO ARE EMPLOYEES OF THE STATE OR ANY LOCAL 5 6 GOVERNMENT ENTITY, SCHOOL DISTRICT, OR SPECIAL TAXING 7 DISTRICT FROM RECEIVING COMPENSATION FROM THE MEMBER'S B PUBLIC EMPLOYER FOR EMPLOYMENT DURING THE MEMBER'S 9 LEGISLATIVE SERVICE: AND AMENDING SECTIONS 5-2-301 AND 10 5-2-302, MCA." 11 12 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA: 13 Section 1. Section 5-2-301, MCA, is amended to read: 14 \*5-2-301. Compensation and expenses for members while 15 in session -- other payment of public employees prohibited. 16 (1) Except as provided in subsection (7), legislators are 17 entitled to a salary commensurate to that of the daily rate 18 of an entry grade 8 classified state employee in effect when the regular session of the legislature in which they serve 19 20 is convened under 5-2-103 for those days during which the 21 legislature is in session. The president of the senate and 22 the speaker of the house shall receive an additional \$5 a

day in salary for those days during which the legislature is

25 (2) Legislators may serve for no salary.

(3) Legislators are entitled to \$50 a day, 7 days a week, during a legislative session, as reimbursement for expenses incurred in attending a session. Expense payments shall stop when the legislature recesses for more than 3 days and shall resume when the legislature reconvenes.

6 (4) Legislators are entitled to a mileage allowance as 7 provided in 2-18-503 for each mile of travel to the place of 8 the holding of the session and to return to their place of 9 residence at the conclusion of the session.

10 (5) In addition to the mileage allowance provided for
11 in subsection (4), legislators, upon submittal of an
12 appropriate claim for such mileage reimbursement to the
13 office of the legislative council, are entitled to:

(a) three additional round trips to their place of
 residence during each regular session; and

(b) such additional round trips as are authorized bythe legislature during special session.

18 (6) Legislators are not entitled to any additional
19 mileage allowance under subsection (4) for a special session
20 if it is convened within 7 days of a regular session.

(7) In lieu of the salary provided for in subsection
(1) and the expense allowance provided for in subsection
(3), a legislator may receive remuneration for services
performed during a legislative session. A legislator
choosing to receive remuneration for services performed

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1 shall file a request to receive payment under this subsection with the accounting office of the legislative 2 council. A legislator exercising the option to receive 3 remuneration for services performed may not receive more 4 remuneration than legislators paid pursuant to subsections 5 6 (1) and (3). Remuneration for services performed must be 7 reduced \$50 a day when the legislature recesses for more 8 than 3 davs.

9 (8) (a) A member of the legislature receiving payment 10 pursuant to this section who is an employee of the state or 11 a county, city, town, school district, special taxing 12 district, or other public entity supported by a tax may not, 13 except as provided in this subsection (8), receive compensation of any kind from the member's public employer 14 for the period of public employment occurring during the 15 16 member's legislative service.

17 (b) Subsection (8)(a) applies only to employees whose
18 contract of employment is agreed to or renewed following
19 [the effective date of this act].

(c) For the purposes of this section, "compensation"
 includes a salary, hourly wage, retirement contribution,
 insurance contribution, and reimbursement for expenses but
 does not include annual or other leave allowed to be taken
 by the member's public employer or compensation paid for
 services performed before the member's legislative service."

Section 2. Section 5-2-302, MCA, is amended to read:

2 "5-2-302. Compensation and expenses when legislature not in session -- other payment of public employees prohibited. (1) When the legislature is not in session, a member of the legislature, while engaged in legislative business with prior authorization of the appropriate funding authority, is entitled to:

8 (1)(a) a mileage allowance as provided in 2-18-503;

9 (2)(b) expenses as provided in 2-18-501 and 2-18-502; 10 and

11 (3) (c) a salary equal to one full day's pay at the rate 12 of a classified state employee, described in 5-2-301(1) for 13 each 24-hour period of time (from midnight to midnight), or 14 portion thereof of the period, spent away from home on 15 authorized legislative business. However, if time spent for business other than authorized legislative business results 16 17 in lengthening a legislator's stay away from home into an 18 additional 24-hour period, he the legislator may not be 19 compensated for the additional day.

20 (2) (a) A member of the legislature receiving payment
21 pursuant to this section who is an employee of the state or
22 a county, city, town, school district, special taxing
23 district, or other public entity supported by a tax may not,
24 except as provided in this subsection (2), receive
25 compensation of any kind from the member's public employer

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for the period of public employment occurring during the 1 2 member's legislative service. 3 (b) Subsection (2)(a) applies only to employees whose 4 contract of employment is agreed to or renewed following 5 [the effective date of this act]. 6 (c) For purposes of this section, "compensation" 7 includes a salary, hourly wage, retirement contribution, 8 insurance contribution, and reimbursement for expenses but 9 does not include annual or other leave allowed to be taken 10 by the member's public employer or compensation paid for 11 services performed before the member's legislative service."

### STATE OF MONTANA - FISCAL NOTE

In compliance with a written request, there is hereby submitted a Fiscal Note for HB0249, as introduced.

## DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

A bill prohibiting members of the legislature who are employees of the state or any local government entity, school district, or special taxing district from receiving compensation from the member's public employer for employment during the member's legislative service.

## ASSUMPTIONS:

- 1 Legislators who are otherwise public employees currently are in leave without pay status during the legislative session. This bill would allow legislator/public employees to receive compensation for annual leave or compensatory time during the legislative session. However, it is assumed that this will not result in additional expenses for public entities because the entity is liable for payment of any accrued leave for which the employee would be eligible to receive compensation.
- 2. Legislators who are otherwise public employees currently receive no compensation for legislative business that occurs while the legislature is not in session, unless it is in the form of annual leave or compensatory time off.
