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A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT DECREASING FROM \$100 TO \$50 THE DRIVER'S LICENSE REINSTATEMENT FEE FOR PERSONS CONVICTED OF CERTAIN DRIVING-RELATED OFFENSES; AMENDING SECTION 61-2-107, MCA; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE."

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

Section 1. Section 61-2-107, MCA, is amended to read:

"61-2-107. (Temporary) License reinstatement fee to fund county drinking and driving prevention programs — balance transferred. (1) Notwithstanding the provisions of any other law of the state, a driver's license that has been suspended or revoked under 61-5-205 or 61-8-402 must remain suspended or revoked until the driver has paid to the department a fee of \$100 in addition to any other fines, forfeitures, and penalties assessed as a result of conviction for a violation of the traffic laws of the state.

- (2) (a) The department shall deposit one-half of the fees collected under subsection (1) in the general fund to be used for funding county drinking and driving prevention programs as provided in 61-2-108.
- 24 (b) The remaining fees collected under subsection (1) 25 that are not allocated under subsection (2)(a) must be

deposited in the general fund. On or before June 30, 1993,

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#### STATE OF MONTANA - FISCAL NOTE

### Form BD-15

In compliance with a written request, there is hereby submitted a Fiscal Note for HB0253, as introduced.

<u>DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION</u>: An act decreasing from \$100 to \$50 the driver's license reinstatement fee for persons convicted of certain driving-related offenses.

### ASSUMPTIONS:

- 1. Assume persons convicted for Driving Under the Influence (DUI) pay one-half of the current \$100 fine to reinstate their driver's license.
- Assume the division's appropriated authority to spend these pass-through funds is reduced by the anticipated decrease in reinstatement fees paid.
- 3. Assume the decrease is applied equally to the general fund, which transfers funds to county DUI task forces to reduce DUIs 61-2-107(2)(a); and to the state special revenue fund, which transfers funds to county treasurers to redistribute to cities and towns who must distribute the money to programs addressing the problems and concerns of minors, but up to one-half of these funds may be used for programs in adult chemical dependency, and law enforcement equipment and training 61-2-107(2)(b).

Net Impact: Reduces state general fund (\$45,000) each year.

EFFECT ON COUNTY OR OTHER LOCAL REVENUES OR EXPENDITURES: Decrease of \$255,000 of pass-through funds to local governments each year to reduce DUIs.
