A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT PROVIDING THAT A 100 PERCENT DISABLED VETERAN MAY PAY THE SAME FEE FOR ANY SPECIAL LICENSE PLATE FOR WHICH THE DISABLED VETERAN IS ELIGIBLE AS THE DISABLED VETERAN WOULD PAY FOR A DISABLED VETERAN'S LICENSE PLATE; AMENDING SECTIONS 49-4-302, 61-3-313, 61-3-332, 61-3-452, 61-3-453, 61-3-454, AND 61-3-504, MCA: AND PROVIDING A DELAYED EFFECTIVE DATE."

- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:
- Section 1. Section 49-4-302, MCA, is amended to read:
- "49-4-302. Privileges of permitholder -- privilege for disabled veteran -- exemptions from time limits -- requirements for special parking spaces. (1) The parking permit issued under this part, when displayed, entitles a person to park a motor vehicle in special parking spaces reserved for handicapped persons whether on public property or on private property available for public use.
- (2) No vehicle other than one lawfully displaying a parking permit issued under this part or one displaying a distinguishing handicapped person's license plate or placard issued by a foreign jurisdiction conferring the same parking privileges as conferred in subsection (1) and conveying a

- handicapped person or one displaying a specially inscribed
  license plate issued under 61-3-332(10)(c)(i)(A) and
  conveying a 100% disabled veteran may be parked in a parking
  space on public or private property that is clearly
  identified by an official sign as being reserved for use by
- 7 (3) The governing body of a city, town, or county may
  8 exempt vehicles lawfully displaying parking permits issued
  9 under this part and vehicles lawfully displaying specially
  10 inscribed license plates issued under 61-3-332(10)(c)(i)(A)
  11 and parked in public places along public streets from any
  12 time limitation imposed upon parking in such area except in
  13 areas where:
- (a) stopping, standing, or parking of all vehicles isprohibited;
  - (b) only special vehicles may be parked; or
- 17 (c) parking is not allowed during specific periods of 18 the day in order to accommodate heavy traffic.
  - (4) In accordance with subsection (2), the governing body of a city, town, or county or appropriate state agency may impose all, but not less than all, of the following requirements with respect to any special parking space constructed after September 30, 1985, and reserved for handicapped persons or permitholders on ways of this state open to the public as defined in 61-8-101:

(a) The space must be located on a smooth, level surface as near as practicable to building entrances or walkways that have curb cuts and appropriately designed ramps and access lanes to accommodate wheelchairs.

- (b) If parallel to curbside, the parking space must be separated from an adjacent space, either in the front or the rear, by at least 5 feet of striped no-parking area.
- (c) If at an angle to curbside, the parking space must be at least 8 feet wide and free of obstruction if located at the end of a line of angle parking spaces, and each other angle parking space designated for handicapped persons must be at least 13 feet wide.
- (d) A parking space reserved for handicapped persons must be designated by a sign showing the international symbol of accessibility and indicating that a permit is required. The sign must be attached to a wall or post in such a way that it is not obscured by a vehicle parked in the space."

- 12 Section 3. Section 61-3-332, MCA, is amended to read:
  - "61-3-332. (Temporary) Number plates. (1) A motor vehicle that is driven upon the streets or highways of Montana must display both front and rear number plates, bearing the distinctive number assigned the vehicle. The number plates are in 10 series: one series for owners of motorcars, one for owners of motor vehicles of the motorcycle or quadricycle type, one for trailers, one for trucks, one for dealers in vehicles of the motorcycle or quadricycle type that bear the distinctive letters "MCD" or the letters "MC" and the word "DEALER", one for franchised dealers in new motorcars (including trucks and trailers) or new and used motorcars (including trucks and trailers) that bear the distinctive letter "D" or the word "DEALER", one

for dealers in used motorcars only (including used trucks and trailers) that bear the distinctive letters "UD" or the letter "U" and the word "DEALER", one for dealers in trailers and/or semitrailers (new or used) that bear the distinctive letters "DTR" or the letters "TR" and the word "DEALER", one for dealers in recreational vehicles that bear 7 the distinctive letters "RV" or the letter "R" and the word "DEALER", and one for special license plates. All markings for the various kinds of dealers' plates must be placed on 10. the number plates assigned thereto in the position that the 11 department designates.

- (2) All number plates for motor vehicles must be issued for a minimum period of 4 years, bear a distinctive marking, and be furnished by the state. In years when number plates are not issued, the department shall provide nonremovable stickers bearing appropriate registration numbers that must be affixed to the license plates in use.
- (3) Subject to the provisions of this section, the department shall create a new design for number plates as provided in this section, and it-shall-manufacture-the-newly designed-number-plates-for-issuance-after-January--17--19917 to-replace;-at-renewal-as-required-in-61-3-312-and-61-3-314; number -- plates -- that -were - displayed - on -motor - vehicles - before that-date.

The county number must be separated from the 16 distinctive registration number by a separation mark unless 17 a letter-number combination is used. The dimensions of such 18 numerals and letters must be determined by the department, 19 and all county and registration numbers must be of equal 20 height.

(b) For vehicles that are owned by the counties, municipalities, irrigation districts organized under the laws of Montana and not operating for profit, and school districts and that are used and operated by officials and employees thereof in line of duty and for vehicles on loan from the United States government or the state of Montana to, or owned by, the civil air patrol and used and operated by officials and employees thereof in the line of duty, there must be placed on the number plates assigned thereto, in a position that the department may designate, the letter "X" or the word "EXEMPT". Distinctive registration numbers for plates assigned to motor vehicles of each of the counties in the state and those of the municipalities and school districts situated within each of the counties and those of the irrigation districts that obtain plates within each county must begin with number one and be numbered Because these number plates are of a consecutively. permanent nature, they are subject to replacement by the department only when the physical condition of the number

    - (8) Number plates issued to a passenger car, truck, trailer, or vehicle of the motorcycle or quadricycle type may be transferred only to a replacement passenger car, truck, trailer, or motorcycle- or quadricycle-type vehicle.

(10) Each type of special license plate approved by the legislature, except collegiate license plates authorized in 61-3-463, must be a separate series of plates, numbered as provided in subsection (5), except that the county number must be replaced by a nonremovable design or designating the group or organization to which the applicant Unless otherwise specifically stated in this section, the special plates are subject to the same rules and laws as govern the issuance of regular license plates, must be placed or mounted on a vehicle owned by the person who is eligible to receive them, and must be removed upon sale or other disposition of the vehicle. The special license plates must be issued to national quard members, former prisoners of war, handicapped persons, reservists, disabled veterans, survivors of the Pearl Harbor attack, veterans of the armed services, or veterans of the armed

- services who were awarded the purple heart medal, who comply with the following provisions:
- 3 (a) An active member of the Montana national guard may
  4 be issued a special license plate with a design or decal

The commanding officer of each armed forces reserve unit shall issue to each eligible member of the reserve unit a certificate authorizing the issuance of one set of plates. The member shall surrender the plates to the department upon becoming ineligible to use them.
  - (c) (i) A resident of Montana who is a veteran of the armed forces of the United States and who is 100% disabled because of an injury that has been determined by the

- department of veterans affairs to be service-connected may,
  upon presentation to the department of proof of the 100%
  disability, be issued:
- (A) a special license plate under this section with a design or decal displaying the letters "DV"; or
- (B) any other plate that the disabled veteran is eligible to receive under this section.

- (i) Upon submission of proof, in a form prescribed by the department, of his the person's qualification under this subsection, there must be issued to each applicant, in lieu of the regular license plates prescribed by law, special license plates numbered in sets of two with a different number on each set. The plates must display:

#### Form BD-15

In compliance with a written request, there is hereby submitted a Fiscal Note for HB0256, as introduced.

<u>DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION</u>: An act providing that a 100% disabled veteran may pay the same fee for any special license plate for which the disabled veteran is eligible as the disabled veteran would pay for a disabled veteran's license plate.

### ASSUMPTIONS:

1. The language in the bill means that a disabled veteran can still purchase just one special plate at the \$5 amount.

FISCAL IMPACT: No fiscal impact to the Department of Justice.

TECHNICAL NOTES: The bill is not clear as to whether a disabled veteran may purchase one or more than one plate at the \$5 amount. If it is intended as more than one, counties would have a small loss of revenue.



## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

Section 1. Section 49-4-302, MCA, is asended to read:

\*49-4-302. Privileges of permitholder -- privilege for disabled veteran -- exemptions from time limits -- requirements for special parking spaces. (1) The parking permit issued under this part, when displayed, entitles a person to park a motor vehicle in special parking spaces reserved for handicapped persons whether on public property or on private property available for public use.

(2) No vehicle other than one lawfully displaying a parking permit issued under this part or one displaying a distinguishing handicapped person's license plate or placard issued by a foreign jurisdiction conferring the same parking



- privileges as conferred in subsection (1) and conveying a handicapped person or one displaying a specially inscribed license plate issued under 61-3-332(10)(c)(i)(A) and conveying a 100% disabled veteran may be parked in a parking space on public or private property that is clearly identified by an official sign as being reserved for use by handicapped persons.
  - (3) The governing body of a city, town, or county may exempt vehicles lawfully displaying parking permits issued under this part and vehicles lawfully displaying specially inscribed license plates issued under 61-3-332(10)(c)(i)(A) and parked in public places along public streets from any time limitation imposed upon parking in such area except in areas where:

The plates must display:
- (A) the word "VETERAN" and a symbol signifying the United States army, United States navy, United States air

- force, United States marine corps, or United States coast guard, according to the record of service verified in the application; or
  - (B) a symbol representing the purple heart medal.
- (ii) Plates must be furnished by the department to the county treasurer, who shall issue them to qualified veterans. The plates must be placed or mounted on the vehicle owned by the veteran designated in the application and must be removed upon sale or other disposition of the vehicle.
