A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT INCREASING THE MEMBERSHIP OF THE BOARD OF REGENTS TO INCLUDE FOUR LEGISLATORS AS EX OFFICIO NONVOTING MEMBERS; AND AMENDING SECTION 2-15-1505, MCA."

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

Section 1. Section 2-15-1505, MCA, is amended to read:

"2-15-1505. Board of regents of higher education. The board of regents of higher education created in Article X, section 9, subsection (2), of the Montana constitution consists of seven members appointed by the governor and confirmed by the senate. The—governor,—superintendent—of public-instruction,—and-commissioner—of-higher-education—are ex—officio Ex officio nonvoting members of the board of regents include:

- (1) the governor, the superintendent of public instruction, and the commissioner of higher education;
- 21 (2) (a) one representative from the majority party and
 22 one representative from the minority party, appointed by the
 23 speaker of the house; and
- 24 (b) one senator from the majority party and one senator
 25 from the minority party, appointed by the committee on
