A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT CREATING SPECIAL
LICENSE PLATES FOR FRATERNAL ORGANIZATIONS; AMENDING
SECTIONS 61-3-332 AND 61-3-446, MCA; AND PROVIDING A DELAYED
EFFECTIVE DATE."

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9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

10 Section 1. Section 61-3-332, MCA, is amended to read: 11 61-3-332, (Temporary) Number plates. (1) A motor 12 vehicle that is driven upon the streets or highways of 13 Montana must display both front and rear number plates. 14 bearing the distinctive number assigned the vehicle. The 15 number plates are in 10 series: one series for owners of 16 motorcars, one for owners of motor vehicles of the 17 motorcycle or quadricycle type, one for trailers, one for 18 trucks, one for dealers in vehicles of the motorcycle or 19 quadricycle type that bear the distinctive letters "MCD" or 20 the letters "MC" and the word "DEALER", one for franchised dealers in new motorcars (including trucks and trailers) or 21 22 new and used motorcars (including trucks and trailers) that 23 bear the distinctive letter "D" or the word "DEALER", one 24 for dealers in used motorcars only (including used trucks 25 and trailers) that bear the distinctive letters "UD" or the

1 letter "U" and the word "DEALER", one for dealers in 2 trailers and/or semitrailers (new or used) that bear the 3 distinctive letters "DTR" or the letters "TR" and the word "DEALER", one for dealers in recreational vehicles that bear the distinctive letters "RV" or the letter "R" and the word 5 б "DEALER", and one for special license plates. All markings 7 for the various kinds of dealers' plates must be placed on 8 the number plates assigned thereto to the dealer in the 9 position that the department designates.

10 (2) All number plates for motor vehicles must be issued 11 for a minimum period of 4 years, bear a distinctive marking, 12 and be furnished by the state. In years when number plates 13 are not issued, the department shall provide nonremovable 14 stickers bearing appropriate registration numbers that must 15 be affixed to the license plates in use.

16 (3) Subject to the provisions of this section, the 17 department shall create a new design for number plates as 18 provided in this section, and it-shall-manufacture-the-newly 19 designed--number--plates-for-issuance-after-danuary-1,-1991, 20 to-replace, at-renewal-as-required-in-61-3-312-and-61-3-314, 21 number-plates-that-were-displayed-on-motor--vehicles--before 22 that-date.

(4) In the case of motorcars and trucks, plates must be
of metal 6 inches wide and 12 inches in length. The outline
of the state of Montana must be used as a distinctive border

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on such the license plates, and the word "Montana" and the
 year must be placed across the plates. Such-registration
 <u>Registration</u> plates must be treated with a reflectorized
 background material according to specifications prescribed
 by the department.

6 (5) The distinctive registration numbers must begin 7 with a number one or with a letter-number combination, such as "A 1" or "AA 1", or any other similar combination of 8 9 letters and numbers. The distinctive registration number or 10 letter-number combination assigned to the vehicle must 11 appear on the plate preceded by the number of the county and 12 appearing in horizontal order on the same horizontal 13 baseline. The county number must be separated from the distinctive registration number by a separation mark unless 14 15 a letter-number combination is used. The dimensions of such 16 numerals and letters must be determined by the department, 17 and all county and registration numbers must be of equal 18 height.

19 (6) For the use of tax-exempt motor vehicles, in
20 addition to the markings provided in this section, number.
21 plates must bear the following distinctive markings:

(a) For vehicles owned by the state, the department may
designate the prefix number for the various state
departments. All numbered plates issued to state departments
must bear the words "State Owned", and no <u>a</u> year number may

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not be indicated thereon on the plates because these
 numbered plates are of a permanent nature and will be
 replaced by the department only when the physical condition
 of numbered plates requires it.

5 (b) For vehicles that are owned by the counties, 6 municipalities, irrigation districts organized under the laws of Montana and not operating for profit, and school 7 districts and that are used and operated by officials and 8 9 employees thereof in line of duty and for vehicles on loan 10 from the United States government or the state of Montana to, or owned by, the civil air patrol and used and operated 11 12 by officials and employees thereof in the line of duty, 13 there must be placed on the number plates assigned thereto to the officials and employees, in a position that the 14 15 department may designate, the letter "X" or the word 16 "EXEMPT". Distinctive registration numbers for plates 17 assigned to motor vehicles of each of the counties in the 18 state and those of the municipalities and school districts 19 situated within each of the counties and those of the 20 irrigation districts that obtain plates within each county 21 must begin with number one and be numbered consecutively. 22 Because these number plates are of a permanent nature, they 23 are subject to replacement by the department only when the 24 physical condition of the number plates requires it and a 25 year number may not be displayed on the number plates.

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1 (7) On all number plates assigned to motor vehicles of 2 the truck and trailer type, other than tax-exempt trucks and 3 tax-exempt trailers, there must appear the letter "T" or the word "TRUCK" on plates assigned to trucks and the letters 4 "TR" or the word "TRAILER" on plates assigned to trailers 5 6 and housetrailers. The letters "MC" or the word "CYCLE" must 7 appear on plates assigned to vehicles of the motorcycle or 8 quadricycle type.

9 (8) Number plates issued to a passenger car, truck,
10 trailer, or vehicle of the motorcycle or quadricycle type
11 may be transferred only to a replacement passenger car,
12 truck, trailer, or motorcycle- or quadricycle-type vehicle.
13 No <u>A</u> registration or license fee may <u>not</u> be assessed upon a
14 transfer of a number plate under 61-3-317 and 61-3-335.

15 (9) For the purpose of this chapter, the several 16 counties of the state are assigned numbers as follows: Silver Bow, 1; Cascade, 2; Yellowstone, 3; Missoula, 4; 17 Lewis and Clark, 5; Gallatin, 6; Flathead, 7; Fergus, 8; 18 19 Powder River, 9; Carbon, 10; Phillips, 11; Hill, 12; Ravalli, 13; Custer, 14; Lake, 15; Dawson, 16; Roosevelt, 20 17; Beaverhead, 18; Chouteau, 19; Valley, 20; Toole, 21; Big 21 22 Horn, 22; Musselshell, 23; Blaine, 24; Madison, 25; Pondera, 23 26; Richland, 27; Powell, 28; Rosebud, 29; Deer Lodge, 30; 24 Teton, 31: Stillwater, 32: Treasure, 33; Sheridan, 34; 25 Sanders, 35; Judith Basin, 36; Daniels, 37; Glacier, 38; Pallon, 39; Sweet Grass, 40; McCone, 41; Carter, 42;
 Broadwater, 43; Wheatland, 44; Prairie, 45; Granite, 46;

 55; Lincoln, 56. Any new counties must be assigned numbers
 by the department as they may be formed, beginning with the
 number 57.

8 (10) Each type of special license plate approved by the legislature, except collegiate license plates authorized in 9 10 61-3-463, must be a separate series of plates, numbered as provided in subsection (5), except that the county number 11 12 must be replaced by a nonremovable design or decal 13 designating the group or organization to which the applicant 14 belongs. Unless otherwise specifically stated in this 15 section, the special plates are subject to the same rules 16 and laws as govern the issuance of regular license plates. 17 must be placed or mounted on a vehicle owned by the person who is eligible to receive them, and must be removed upon 18 19 sale or other disposition of the vehicle. The special license plates must be issued to national guard members, 20 21 former prisoners of war, handicapped persons, reservists, 22 disabled veterans, survivors of the Pearl Harbor attack, 23 veterans of the armed services, or veterans of the armed services who were awarded the purple heart medal, or members 24 25 of fraternal organizations who comply with the following

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1 provisions:

(a) An active member of the Montana national guard may 2 3 be issued a special license plate with a design or decal displaying the letters "NG". The adjutant general shall 4 issue to each active member of the Montana national quard a 5 certificate authorizing the department to issue one set of 6 national guard plates, and the member shall surrender the 7 plates to the department upon becoming ineligible to use 8 9 them.

10 (b) An active member of the reserve armed forces of the United States of America who is a resident of this state may 11 12 be issued a special license plate with a design or decal 13 displaying the following: United States army reserve, AR (symbol); United States naval reserve, NR (anchor); United 14 States air force reserve, AFR (symbol); and United States 15 marine corps reserve, MCR (globe and anchor). The commanding 16 officer of each armed forces reserve unit shall issue to 17 each eligible member of the reserve unit a certificate 18 19 authorizing the issuance of one set of plates. The member shall surrender the plates to the department upon becoming 20 21 ineligible to use them.

(c) A resident of Montana who is a veteran of the armed
forces of the United States and who is 100% disabled because
of an injury that has been determined by the department of
veterans affairs to be service-connected may, upon

presentation to the department of proof of the 100%
 disability, be issued a special license plate under this
 section with a design or decal displaying the letters "DV".

4 (i) The fee for original or renewal registration by a 5 100% disabled veteran for a passenger vehicle or a truck 6 with a GVW-rated capacity of 1 ton or less is \$5 and is in 7 lieu of all other fees and taxes for that vehicle under this 8 chapter.

9 (ii) Special license plates issued to a disabled veteran10 are not transferable to another person.

(iii) A disabled veteran is not entitled to a special
 license plate for more than one vehicle.

13 (iv) A vehicle lawfully displaying a disabled veteran's
14 plate and that is conveying a 100% disabled veteran is
15 entitled to the parking privileges allowed a handicapped
16 person's vehicle under this title.

(d) A Montana resident who is a veteran of the armed 17 forces of the United States and was captured and held 18 19 prisoner by a military force of a foreign nation, documented by his the veteran's service record, may upon application 20 and presentation of proof be issued a special license plate 21 22 with a design or decal displaying the words "ex-prisoner of 23 war" or an abbreviation the department considers 24 appropriate.

25 (e) Upon payment of all taxes and fees required by

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1 parts 3 and 5 of this chapter and upon furnishing proof 2 satisfactory to the department that the applicant meets the 3 requirements of this subsection (e), the department shall 4 issue to a Montana resident who is a veteran of the armed 5 services of the United States special license plates, for 6 one motor vehicle only, designed to indicate that the 7 applicant is a survivor of the Pearl Harbor attack if the 8 applicant was a member of the United States armed forces on 9 December 7, 1941, was on station on December 7, 1941, during 10 the hours of 7:55 a.m. to 9:45 a.m. (Hawaii time) at Pearl 11 Harbor, the island of Oahu, or offshore at a distance of not 12 more than 3 miles, and received an honorable discharge from 13 the United States armed forces. If special license plates 14 issued under this subsection are lost, stolen, or mutilated, 15 the recipient of the plates is entitled to replacement 16 plates upon request and without charge.

17 (f) A motor vehicle owner and resident of this state 18 who is a veteran of the armed services of the United States 19 may be issued license plates inscribed as provided in 20 subsection (10)(f)(i) if he <u>the person</u> was separated from 21 the armed services under other than dishonorable 22 circumstances or was awarded the purple heart medal:

(i) Upon submission of proof, in a form prescribed by
the department, of his the person's qualification under this
subsection, there must be issued to each applicant, in lieu

of the regular license plates prescribed by law, special license plates numbered in sets of two with a different number on each set. The plates must display:

4 (A) the word "VETERAN" and a symbol signifying the 5 United States army, United States navy, United States air 6 force, United States marine corps, or United States coast 7 guard, according to the record of service verified in the 8 application; or

9 (B) a symbol representing the purple heart medal.

10 (ii) Plates must be furnished by the department to the 11 county treasurer, who shall issue them to qualified 12 veterans. The plates must be placed or mounted on the 13 vehicle owned by the veteran designated in the application 14 and must be removed upon sale or other disposition of the 15 vehicle.

16 (iii) Each veteran who receives special license plates 17 under this subsection (10)(f) is liable for payment of all 18 taxes and fees required under parts 3 and 4 of this chapter 19 and a special veteran's or purple heart medal license plate 20 fee of \$10. Upon an original application for a license under 21 this subsection (10)(f), the county treasurer shall:

22 (A) deposit \$3 of the special fee in the county general23 fund;

(B) remit \$1 for deposit in the state general fund; and(C) deposit the remainder of the special fee in the

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state special revenue fund to the credit of the department
 of military affairs to be appropriated by the legislature
 for construction, operation, and maintenance of the state
 veterans' cemetery.

5 (iv) Upon subsequent annual renewal of registration, the
6 county treasurer shall deposit all of the special fee as
7 provided in subsection (10)(f)(iii)(C).

8 (g) A Montana resident who is a member of a fraternal 9 organization may, upon application and presentation of 10 eligibility issued by the fraternal organization, be issued 11 a special license plate with a design or decal displaying 12 the fraternal organization insignia.

13 (g)(h) A Montana resident who is eligible to receive a 14 special parking permit under 49-4-301 may, upon written 15 application on a form prescribed by the department, be 16 issued a special license plate with a design or decal 17 bearing a representation of a wheelchair as the symbol of 18 the handicapped person. (Terminates July 1, 1996--sec. 4, 19 Ch. 654, L. 1989.)

2 (iii) Each veteran who receives special license plates 3 under this subsection (10)(f) is liable for payment of all 4 taxes and fees required under parts 3 and 4 of this chapter 5 and a special veteran's or purple heart medal license plate 6 fee of \$10. Upon an original application for a license under 7 this subsection (10)(f), the county treasurer shall:

8 (A) deposit \$3 of the special fee in the county general9 fund;

10 (B) remit \$1 for deposit in the state general fund; and 11 (C) deposit the remainder of the special fee in the 12 state special revenue fund to the credit of the department 13 of military affairs to be appropriated by the legislature 14 for construction, operation, and maintenance of the state 15 veterans' cemetery.

16 (iv) Upon subsequent annual renewal of registration, the
17 county treasurer shall deposit all of the special fee as
18 provided in subsection (10)(f)(iii)(C).

19 (g) A Montana resident who is a member of <u>a fraternal</u>
20 organization may, upon application and presentation of
21 eligibility issued by the fraternal organization, be issued
22 <u>a special license plate with a design or decal displaying</u>
23 the fraternal organization insignia.

24 (g)(h) A Montana resident who is eligible to receive a
 25 special parking permit under 49-4-301 may, upon written

application on a form prescribed by the department, be

In compliance with a written request, there is hereby submitted a Fiscal Note for HB0270, as introduced.

DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

An act creating special license plates for fraternal organizations.

ASSUMPTIONS:

- It is assumed that 10,000 fraternal organization members will purchase special fraternal organization license plates. Half the number (5,000) will purchase plates in FY94 and half (5,000) in FY95. The bill proposes an effective date of January 1, 1994.
- 2. Start-up expenditures in the Department of Justice will be design costs of \$2,000 (FY94) and 150 hours of computer programming at a cost \$5,700 (FY94). In addition, postage and handling will cost \$5 per set of special license plates.
- 3. Although the executive budget recommended funding this proposal with highways state special revenue, it is shown as general fund on this fiscal note to be consistent with the General Government and Transportation Appropriations Subcommittee action on January 22, 1993, to reject the funding switch.
