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A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT PROHIBITING THE ISSUANCE OF RETAIL LIQUOR LICENSES TO ESTABLISHMENTS WITHIN 2,500 FEET OF A STATE OR FEDERAL HIGHWAY IF MORE THAN 30 PERCENT OF THE ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES TO BE CONSUMED ON THE PREMISES WILL BE CONSUMED BY PERSONS NOT RESIDING WITHIN A 25-MILE RADIUS OF THE ESTABLISHMENT."

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
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BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

NEW SECTION. Section 1. Proximity to highways restricted. (1) (a) Except as provided in subsections (2) and (3), a retail license may not be issued pursuant to this code to any business or enterprise outside of an incorporated city if the business or enterprise is located within 2,500 feet of a state or federal highway and more than 30% of the alcoholic beverages to be consumed on the premises will be consumed by individuals not residing within a 25-mile radius of the business or enterprise. The distance from the highway must be measured from the nearest edge of the highway to the nearest entrance of the business or enterprise. This section is a limitation upon the department's licensing authority.

(b) There is a rebuttable presumption that more than



- 1 30% of the alcoholic beverages to be consumed on the

- 3 subsection (1)(a) will be consumed by persons not residing
- 4 within a 25-mile radius of the business or establishment.
- 5 The burden of proof is on the license applicant to
- 6 demonstrate to the department's satisfaction that sales of
- 7 alcoholic beverages will not violate the provisions of
- 8 subsection (1)(a).
- 9 (2) The department may renew or approve the transfer of
- 10 a license for any establishment located in violation of
- 11 subsection (1) if the establishment was located on the site
- 12 prior to October 1, 1993.
- 13 (3) Subsection (1) does not apply to licenses for the
- 14 sale of beer, table wine, or both in the original package
- 15 for off-premises consumption.
- 16 NEW SECTION. Section 2. Codification instruction.
- 17 [Section 1] is intended to be codified as an integral part
- 18 of Title 16, chapter 3, part 3, and the provisions of Title
- 19 16, chapter 3, part 3, apply to [section 1].
