In compliance with a written request, there is hereby submitted a Fiscal Note for HB0316, as introduced.

<u>DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION</u>: An act specifying the minimum daily staffing pattern for nursing services in long-term care facilities.

ASSUMPTIONS:

Department of Corrections and Human Services

- 1. The Montana Veterans Nursing Home (MVH), Montana State Hospital at Warm Springs (MSH-WS) and Galen (MSH-G), and the Montana Center for the Aged at Lewistown (CA) would all be required to meet the staffing levels outlined in the act.
- The word "beds" in the act means actual beds used, not capacity.
- 3. Under assumption # 2 above, the Warm Springs and Galen facilities of Department of Corrections and Human Services would meet the requirements of the act now.
- 4. MVH will have an Average Daily Population (ADP), of approximately 90 beds and require an additional 6.00 FTE direct care givers at grade 7 entry level under the act.
- 5. CA will have an ADP of approximately 140 beds and require an additional 17.00 FTE direct care givers at grade 7 entry level under the act.
- 6. Current law represents the Executive recommended current level in the CA and MVH.
- 7. The "daytime", "evening", and "nighttime" in the bill would be compatible with shifts now worked at the institutions.
- 8. Federal funding at the MVH is fixed on a per client basis and would not be increased to fund additional staff.

- 9. A mandatory staffing pattern defined in state statute would be implemented and regulated under the Licensure Bureau of DHES.
- 10. Such a regulatory effort conducted at the state level with state inspectors acting under state statute would require additional agency personnel to cover 101 nursing homes offering skilled nursing care in the state to enforce the proposed law.
- 11. The proposed law does not address remedial action. The Licensure Bureau assumes much effort would be devoted to addressing and resolving complaints in addition to regular survey (inspection) activities.
- 12. The proposed law would require the Licensure Bureau to assume survey activities, monitoring of staffing patterns, and response activities to complaints. Personnel services to accommodate the additional functions would require one health care facility surveyor (grade 14) and an administrative technician (grade 11). Operating expenses are estimated to be \$48,000 each year.
- 13. Current level represents the Executive budget recommendation for the Health Facilities Division.
- 13. If this bill is passed the Department of Health and Environmental Sciences will need a general fund appropriation of \$124,345 for FY94 and \$124,345 in FY95.

ASSUMPTIONS: (Continued)

Department of Social and Rehabilitation Services

- 1. The average wages and benefits for all facilities of licensed staff (DON, RN, LPN) is \$16.65/hour.
- 2. The hourly wages and benefits for all facilities of non-licensed staff (Aids, DCG) is \$8.15.
- 3. Hourly data by shift is from November 1992 staffing report and is annualized.
- Staffing requirements were calculated on the basis of total occupied beds for November, 1992.
- 5. There are 49 nursing facilities with less than 60 beds, 41 nursing facilities that have over 59 and less than 120 beds and 14 nursing facilities with greater than 119 beds in Montana.
- 6. The total medicaid nursing home bed days will be 1,415,702 in FY94 and 1,429,859 in FY95.
- 7. An analysis of costs by facility based on existing staffing patterns resulted in a net increase of \$1.53/bed day.
- 8. The federal participation rate is 71.02% in FY94 and 70.5% in FY95.
- 9. This fiscal note does not account for nurse aid training costs or recruitment costs.
