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BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

NEW SECTION. Section 1. Definitions. Unless the context requires otherwise, in [sections 1 through 3], the following definitions apply:

- (1) "Application" means an application for a beneficial water use permit pursuant to 85-2-302 or a water reservation pursuant to 85-2-316.
- (2) "Ground water" means water that is beneath the land surface or beneath the bed of a stream, lake, reservoir, or other body of surface water and that is not immediately or directly connected to surface water.
- (3) "Nonconsumptive use" means a beneficial use of water that does not cause a reduction in the source of supply and in which substantially all of the water returns without delay to the source of supply, causing little or no

l disruption in stream conditions.

In compliance with a written request, there is hereby submitted a Fiscal Note for HB0365, as introduced.

<u>DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION</u>: This bill proposes a legislative closure for the Teton River Drainage Basin,
No. 41-0, including its tributaries, mainly in Teton and Chouteau Counties and a small portion of southeastern Pondera
County. The closure would prohibit the Department of Natural Resources and Conservation from receiving and processing any
applications for consumptive, beneficial use of surface water except for domestic, municipal, stock or stored water during
high spring flows or temporary emergency appropriations. It also nullifies those certain water reservations granted on
June 30, 1992 by the Board of Natural Resources and Conservation to the Departments of Fish, Wildlife and Parks and Health
and Environmental Sciences.

ASSUMPTIONS:

- 1. This proposed bill essentially closes the basin to any consumptive surface water permit applications.
- 2. The Department of Natural Resources and Conservation (DNRC) received applications for and issued 28 surface water permits in the Teton River Drainage Basin, No. 41-0, between July 1, 1973 and January 28, 1993, as follows: 7 stock, 17 irrigation, 1 domestic, 2 commercial, and 1 fish and wildlife. Of the 28 permits, 27 were issued between 1974 and 1984.
- 3. Only one surface water permit was issued during the 9 year period from 1984 to 1993. This single permit was issued for a commercial use at a rate of 90 GPM not to exceed 11.93 acre-feet of water per year.
- 4. The drastic reduction in applications for permits for surface water use in the Teton Basin during the past ten years is due to the fact that adequate flows of water do not exist on a reliable basis to justify any monetary investment to develop a water project. This reduction is also due to the Havre Water Resources Regional Office informing potential applicants of the water availability status in the basin which has convinced them that they would most likely not be successful in obtaining a consumptive water use permit from a surface water source.
- 5. Should HB0365 be enacted, the DNRC workload in the Teton River Basin would essentially remain the same.
- 6. The Departments of Fish, Wildlife and Parks and Health and Environmental Sciences would be unable to implement the instream flow program granted by the Board of Natural Resources final order establishing water reservations above Fort Peck Dam.

FISCAL IMPACT: None.

<u>EFFECT ON COUNTY OR OTHER LOCAL REVENUES OR EXPENDITURES:</u> The Board of Natural Resources final order also states that conservation districts reservations in the basin for which a development plan has not been submitted and approved shall have no force and effect. (See note below)

TECHNICAL NOTES: New Section 3 specifies that water reservations of the DHES and DFWP will have no force and effect upon closure of the basin. The section fails to include the Teton County and the Choteau County conservation districts in this exclusion.
