STATEMENT OF INTENT

A statement of intent is required for this bill because [section 5] grants rulemaking authority to the department of health and environmental sciences to coordinate an incentive program to attract semiretired physicians to Montana's rural areas where access to medical services is extremely limited or nonexistent.

It is the intent of the legislature that the incentive program provided in this bill be used to recruit physicians who are willing to operate a limited, part-time medical practice in Montana's medical shortage areas in exchange for state property tax and income tax exemptions.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

2 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Section 1. Short title. [Sections 1 through 5] may be cited as the "Physician Procurement Act".

NEW SECTION. Section 2. Purpose. The purpose of [sections 1 through 5] is to attract semiretired physicians willing to provide medical services at a low cost to rural areas in Montana that have a shortage of medical services and to improve rural Montanans' access to medical care.

9 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Section 3.** Definitions. As used in [sections 1 through 5], unless the context requires otherwise, the following definitions apply:

- (1) "Department" means the department of health and environmental sciences provided for in Title 2, chapter 15, part 21.
 - (2) "Medical shortage area" means:
- (a) an area designated by the department as a health professional shortage area under federal guidelines; or
- 8 (b) an area designated by the department as a medical 9 shortage area under department rules adopted pursuant to 0 (sections 1 through 5).
- (3) "Physician" means a physician licensed to practice
 medicine in this state or in any other state.
- (4) "Practice" means the location of a physician'sprimary place of providing medical services to the public.
