## STATE OF MONTANA - FISCAL NOTE

Form BD-15

In compliance with a written request, there is hereby submitted a Fiscal Note for HB0449, as introduced.

## DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

An act exempting gardeners, farm owners, and farm operators who sell raw and unprocessed farm products at a farmer's market from licensure under food establishment laws; and providing an immediate effective date.

## ASSUMPTIONS:

- 1. The number of annual food purveyor establishment licenses issued will remain reasonably constant (DHES).
- 2. The current annual food purveyor license fee of \$60 has 85% (\$51) deposited in the state special revenue account (local board inspection fund), 7.5% (\$4.50) deposited in the state general fund and 7.5% (\$4.50) deposited in the special revenue account earmarked for the department (DHES).
- 3. Proposed language within the definition of "raw and unprocessed farm products" would primarily exempt honey processors from licensure when selling in "farmers markets" who bottle extracted and refined honey. An estimated 50 honey processors utilizing organized farmers markets statewide would become exempt from licensure. Proposed language would also exempt from licensure producers of food preserved by "drying", which is defined as a food process. It is not known if anyone using organized farmers markets statewide is currently licensed utilizing strictly this process. All other inclusions and exemptions within the definition of "raw and unprocessed farm products" appear to be consistent with current interpretation of the existing law (DHES).
- 4. The introduced HB 449 removes the requirements for licensure of producers of exempted product, but does not remove the requirements for product standards, sanitary production facilities, or sanitary production procedures. The workload of inspections and enforcement required of local and state public health agencies is not changed. Inspections and enforcement not performed by county agencies would be done by the state (DHES).
- 5. Under the Department of Agriculture, all farmer's market sellers currently are exempt.

## BFFECT ON COUNTY OR OTHER LOCAL REVENUES OR EXPENDITURES:

Local public health agencies would lose an estimated \$2,550 from the loss of license fee revenues for operating expenditures. Products and facilities of producers exempted from licensure must still be inspected and meet sanitary operating procedures.

## LONG-RANGE EFFECTS OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

Local public health agencies, due to revenue loss, would probably discontinue the inspection process of licensure exempted establishments/producers. The local operating cost of \$2,550 for inspection and enforcement activities currently performed by counties would probably be returned to the state. Without licensure, the state would also lack a funding source for this specific activity. State costs would increase due to the need to contract personnel resources for this purpose with extensive traveling necessary to conduct the inspection and enforcement activities statewide. The seasonal production of the proposed exempted producers would necessitate more available staff time than current state FTE levels.

#### TECHNICAL NOTES:

1. Introduced HB 449 Section 1 language in 50-50-102 (2) to include a "farmer's market" as an exemption to the defined term "commercial" is not accurate as the majority of "farmer's markets" are not operated as not for profit or nonprofit organizations.

2. Introduced HB 449 Section 1 language in 50-50-102 ( $\frac{15}{15}$ ) for "raw and unprocessed farm products" conflicts with provisions of the definition 50-50-102 ( $\frac{6}{1}$ ) "food manufacturing establishment".
