In compliance with a written request, there is hereby submitted a Fiscal Note for HB0463, as introduced.

<u>DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION</u>: An act allocating a percentage of the boat fee in lieu of tax to the motorboat account in the state special revenue fund; requiring use of the fees by the Department of Fish, Wildlife and Parks for boating facilities under the control of the department; allowing use of the fees for matching available federal funds; creating the boating advisory council and providing that costs associated with the council be paid from the fees effective July 1, 1993.

ASSUMPTIONS:

- 1. Based on a telephone survey of Lewis and Clark, Yellowstone and Custer Counties, the average fee in lieu of taxes in 1992 was \$20.50.
- 2. Statewide there were 41,108 registered boats in 1992.
- 3. The five-person boating advisory council will meet five times per year for one day per meeting. The Department of Fish, Wildlife and Parks (FWP) will pay for the \$2,500 annual cost of these meeting out of the funds derived from this bill.
- 4. Counties will modify forms to collect required information under new section 2(1).
