STATEMENT OF INTENT

A statement of intent is required for this bill because [section 1] requires that rules be adopted to establish details of the healthy start program. The legislature intends that the rules define a program based upon the healthy start model developed by the state of Hawaii.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

NEW SECTION. Section 1. Healthy start program. (1) There is a healthy start pilot program in the department. The goals of the program are to provide for early identification, intervention, and family support services to prevent child abuse and neglect and to enhance parent functioning and child development.

(2) The department shall adopt rules establishing program details to accomplish community-based screening, voluntary home visits to high-risk families, planning and

coordination of services to families, parent skill building, child assessment and screening, and data collection for program evaluation.

- (3) The department shall contract with or purchase services from private child— and family—serving organizations for operation of the pilot program.
- (4) The legislature encourages units of the Montana university system to provide technical assistance to the department in designing the pilot program and to participate in evaluation of the pilot program.

NEW SECTION. Section 2. Codification instruction.

[Section 1] is intended to be codified as an integral part

of Title 52, chapter 2, and the provisions of Title 52,

chapter 2, apply to [section 1].
