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A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT ALLOWING A PERSON TO GIVE BINDING INSTRUCTIONS THAT THE PERSON'S REMAINS BE CREMATED OR DISPOSED OF BY OTHER LAWFUL MEANS; AND AMENDING SECTIONS 37-19-101 AND 37-19-311, MCA."

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

NEW SECTION. Section 1. Instructions for disposition of person's remains. A person may provide written instructions as part of a prearranged funeral plan for disposition of the person's remains through cremation or other lawful means. The person shall execute the instrument containing the instructions with proof of acknowledgment as provided in 1-5-101.

NEW SECTION. Section 2. Person's directions to be followed —— exception. Unless a compelling public interest makes it impossible to comply with a person's directions as provided in [section 1], the remains of a person must be disposed of as instructed in an instrument prepared as provided in [section 1].
