In accordance with the power vested in me as Governor by the Constitution and laws of the State of Montana, I hereby return House Bill No. 530, "AN ACT ALLOWING THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION TO ISSUE SPECIAL PERMITS FOR CERTAIN TRUCK-TRAILERTRAILER VEHICLE COMBINATIONS THAT ARE NOT MORE THAN 95 FEET IN LENGTH; AMENDING SECTION 61-10-124, MCA; AND PROVIDING AN IMMEDIATE EFFECTIVE DATE," with the attached amendments for the following reasons.

Upon effect of House Bill 530, vehicles known as truck-trailertrailers will no longer be permitted to haul gravel on all routes used before July 1, 1987. The bill takes effect on passage and approval. The proposed amendment would change the date of effect to July 1, 1993, in order to allow the completion of most of the existing contracts which were entered into before the passage of this legislation.
