House BILL NO. 544 2 INTRODUCED BY 3 A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: 4 "AN ACT INCREASING THE 5 RESPONSIBILITY OF THE DEPARTMENT OF FAMILY SERVICES FOR 6 PROTECTION OF ELDERLY MONTANANS; REQUIRING THE DEPARTMENT TO PROVIDE A PROGRAM FOR PROTECTIVE SERVICES; AND AMENDING 7 8 SECTIONS 52-3-101 AND 52-3-205, MCA." 9 10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA: Section 1. Section 52-3-101, MCA, is amended to read: 11 12 "52-3-101. Functions of department of family services. The department of family services shall: 13 14 (1) consult with and advise organized efforts by

15 communities, organizations, associations, and groups that 16 are working toward any forms of assistance to problems of 17 aging;

18 (2) study and identify problems of aging;

19 (3) review existing programs for the aging and make recommendations to the governor and the legislature for 20 21 improvements in such programs;

22 (4) encourage the sponsorship of community projects 23 which will seek to make optimum use of the time and talents 24 of retired persons;

25 (5) coordinate, through area councils on aging, the

delivery of community-based care, including but not limited 1 2 to home health care, homemaker services, foster home care, 3 nutrition, transportation, winterization, information and 4 referral, and recreation;

5 (6) provide for the protection of aged persons whose health or welfare is or may be adversely affected and 6 7 further threatened by the conduct of those responsible for 8 their care and protection. It is intended that the mandatory 9 reporting of cases by professional people and community 10 members to the appropriate authority will cause the 11 protective services providers of the state to seek to 12 prevent further abuses and will protect and enhance the welfare of aged persons." 13 14 Section 2. Section 52-3-205, MCA, is amended to read: 15 \*52-3-205. Departmental authority. The department may 16 shall implement a program for protective services by 17 establishing appropriate rules which that are not

18 inconsistent with the department's activities."
