HOUSE BILL NO. 560

INTRODUCED BY Limpkins 1

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A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT REQUIRING A HEALTH CARE PROVIDER AND LABORATORY PERSONNEL TO REPORT BY NAME A PATIENT WHO SUFFERS FROM AIDS OR AN HIV-RELATED CONDITION; PROVIDING IMMUNITY FOR THE HEALTH CARE PROVIDER AND FOR AND PERSONNEL: PROVIDING A PENALTY FOR LABORATORY NONCOMPLIANCE WITH THE REPORTING REQUIREMENTS."

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

NEW SECTION. Section 1. Reports HIV-related condition -- immunity -- penalty. (1) A health care provider who diagnoses or treats an individual for AIDS or an HIV-related condition as defined in 50-16-1003 shall file a report with the department of health and environmental sciences, in a form and within a time period designated by the department. A health care provider shall report to the department any death from an HIV-related condition.

- (2) A report made under the provisions of subsection (1) must contain the name, date of birth, sex, and address of the patient and the name and address of the health care provider.
- (3) A report made pursuant to this section does not 24 constitute libel or slander or a violation of the right of 25

1 privacy or privileged communication.

- 2 (4) A person who in good faith complies with the 3 provisions of [section 2] or this section is immune from civil and criminal liability for an action taken pursuant to [section 2] or this section. Compliance by a health care provider with the requirements of this section and with 7 regulations promulgated by the department fulfills the duty of the health care provider to a third party.
- 9 (5) A violation of subsection (1) is subject to the 10 provisions of 37-2-301.

NEW SECTION. Section 2. Reports of positive HIV tests. 11 12 All laboratories or persons performing HIV-related tests, as 13 defined in 50-16-1003, shall report to the department of 14 health and environmental sciences, in a form and within a 15 time period designated by the department, the name, date of birth, sex, and address of any individual whose specimen 16 17 submitted for examination tests positive for HIV, as defined 18 in 50-16-1003. The report must include the test results and the name and address of the health care provider referring 19 20 the positive specimen for testing.

NEW SECTION. Section 3. Use of reports. The public 21 22 health reports required to be submitted by [sections 1 and 23 2] are subject to the provisions of 50-16-1009.

24 NEW SECTION. Section 4. Codification instruction. 25 [Sections 1 through 3] are intended to be codified as an

- 1 integral part of Title 50, chapter 16, and the provisions of
- 2 Title 50, chapter 16, apply to [sections 1 through 3].

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
