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BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

A person who elects to become a member of the sheriffs' retirement system pursuant to 19-7-301 may transfer the member's creditable service in the public employees' retirement system into the sheriffs' retirement system under the provisions of 19-7-309.
