A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT PROVIDING FOR MATCHING GRANTS TO PUBLIC K-12 SCHOOLS, VOCATIONAL-TECHNICAL CENTERS, AND COMMUNITY COLLEGES FOR TELECOMMUNICATIONS INFRASTRUCTURE AND EQUIPMENT; PROVIDING THAT THE GRANTS BE ADMINISTERED BY THE MONTANA BOARD OF SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY DEVELOPMENT; AND APPROPRIATING \$5 MILLION FROM THE COAL SEVERANCE TAX PERMANENT TRUST FUND."

STATEMENT OF INTENT

A statement of intent is required for this bill because [section 2] grants rulemaking authority to the Montana board of science and technology development to implement the telecommunications grant provisions of [sections 1 and 2]. It is the legislature's intent that the board adopt rules establishing application procedures, criteria to be used for awarding grants, the review process to be followed by the board in awarding grants, and other matters necessary for the proper administration of the grant program.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

NEW SECTION. Section 1. Appropriation. There is appropriated the amount of \$5 million from the coal



severance tax permanent trust fund, established under
Article IX, section 5, of the Montana constitution, to the
telecommunications projects account established in [section
2]. The money must be used to provide grants on a matching
basis and loans to public K-12 schools, vocational-technical
centers, and community colleges for acquisition of
telecommunications infrastructure and equipment. The Montana
board of science and technology development shall administer
the appropriation.

NEW SECTION. Section 2. Telecommunications projects

NEW SECTION. Section 2. Telecommunications projects account -- goals and criteria -- rulemaking. (1) There is a telecommunications projects account in the state special revenue fund into which the money appropriated in [section 1] must be deposited. Any funds remaining in the account at the end of a fiscal year do not revert to the general fund but remain in the account and must be used for the purposes of this section.

(2) Notwithstanding any provision of Title 90, chapter 3, the Montana board of science and technology development may award grants on a matching basis to public K-12 schools, vocational-technical centers, and community colleges to

procure telecommunications infrastructure and equipment. The
money may not be used for administration or operation of

24 telecommunications systems or equipment.

25 (3) Each grant must be matched on a one-to-one basis by

- 2 (4) In developing criteria to be used in awarding
