WHEREAS, the denial of Oregon's plan did not provide guidelines and parameters under which the federal government would reconsider the plan, which does not give any guidance to states as to what are the federal expectations; and

whereas, the federal government has opened the possibility of waivers on federal requirements, but the refusal to approve a waiver for Oregon's plan shows a
