House JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 28

INTRODUCED BY

A JOINT RESOLUTION OF THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MONTANA CONCERNING ALL ACTS OF VIOLENCE AND TERRORISM IN MONTANA AND URGING FEDERAL LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES TO ASSIST IN INVESTIGATING THE FIREBOMBING OF THE BLUE MOUNTAIN MEDICAL CLINIC IN MISSOULA.

WHEREAS, on March 29, 1993, arsonists firebombed and destroyed the Blue Mountain Medical Clinic in Missoula, Montana; and

WHEREAS, Governor Marc Racicot and Attorney General Joe Mazurek have publicly condemned the violent attack on the Blue Mountain Medical Clinic; and

WHEREAS, in the past year, acts of terrorism directed at Montana medical facilities and staffs that provide abortions have increased; and

WHEREAS, these increases in terrorist activities have threatened the lives and liberties of Montana citizens and their families; and

WHEREAS, these acts of violence and terrorism directly violate sections 3, 4, and 10 of the Declaration of Rights provisions of Article II of the Montana Constitution; and

WHEREAS, the acts of terrorism committed in Montana are

markedly similar to acts of terrorism occurring in other parts of the United States.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

(1) That the members of the 53rd Legislature encourage Montana's Attorney General and all state law enforcement agencies to use all available resources to pursue and bring to justice the perpetrators of terrorist violence in Montana.

(2) That Montana law enforcement agencies be encouraged to increase security to protect the property, staff, and clients at medical facilities providing abortions.

(3) That the United States Attorney General be requested to actively investigate the terrorist actions occurring at the Blue Mountain Medical Clinic and to direct that additional security be provided at Montana medical facilities providing abortions.

(4) That the United States Department of Justice, the Federal Bureau of Investigation, and other federal law enforcement agencies be strongly urged to assist Montana law enforcement agencies in investigating the Blue Mountain Medical Clinic arson case and any similar incidents of terrorist violence occurring in Montana.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that copies of this resolution
