17 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

18 NEW SECTION. Section 1. Interagency coordinating
19 council for state prevention programs. (1) There is an
20 interagency coordinating council for state prevention
21 programs consisting of the following nine members:

22 (a) the director of the department of family services
23 provided for in 2-15-2401;

24 (b) the director of the department of health and
25 environmental sciences provided for in 2-15-2101;

1 (c) the director of the department of corrections and
2 human services provided for in 2-15-2301;

3 (d) the attorney general or, as a designee, the
4 administrator of the board of crime control provided for in
5 2-15-2006;

6 (e) the director of the department of social and
7 rehabilitation services provided for in 2-15-2201;

8 (f) the superintendent of public instruction provided
9 for in 2-15-701;

10 (g) the presiding officer of the Montana children's
11 trust fund board; and

12 (h) two persons appointed by the governor who have
13 experiences related to the private or nonprofit provision of
14 prevention programs and services.

15 (2) The coordinating council shall perform the
16 following duties:

17 (a) develop through interagency planning efforts a
18 comprehensive and coordinated prevention program delivery

20 (b) develop appropriate interagency prevention programs
21 and services that address the problems of at-risk children
22 and families and that can be provided in a flexible manner

22 administrative purposes only to the governor's office, which
23 shall provide staff and budgetary, administrative, and
24 clerical services to the council as the council or its
25 presiding officer requests.

STATE OF MONTANA - FISCAL NOTE

In compliance with a written request, there is hereby submitted a Fiscal Note for SB0034, as introduced.

DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

An act creating an interagency coordinating council for state prevention programs and services for children and families.

ASSUMPTIONS:

1. There will be six (6) two-day meetings per year and all will be held in Helena.
2. The Governor's Office will provide staff, with the exception of the two appointed council members and the presiding officer of the Montana children's trust fund board.
3. The presiding officer of the Montana children's trust fund board is not a state employee.
4. The two appointed council members and the presiding officer of the Montana children's trust fund board will receive reimbursement, for each meeting, for items as follows: Honorarium, \$25; mileage (assume \$0.28 per mile and average travel of 450 miles round trip per meeting, \$126; lodging (two nights at \$31.28 per night), \$62.56; meals (two meals per day, for two days at \$15.50 per meal), \$62. The total average cost per member per Meeting will be \$275.56.
5. Total costs for the three council members for the six meetings will be \$4,960.08 (\$275.56 X 3 X 6).
6. Without detail, it is difficult to estimate the cost of printing and postage. A rough estimate of \$500 for FY94 and \$3,500 for FY95 is included.
7. The total costs for this legislation will be \$5,460 for FY94 (\$4,960 + \$500) and \$8,460 for FY95 (\$4,960 + \$3,500).
8. Costs will be shared by six agencies (DFS, DHES, DCHS, SRS, OPI, DOJ). The total cost per agency will be \$910 for FY94 (\$5,460/6), and \$1,410 for FY95 (\$8,460/6).




