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4	A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT CREATING SPECIAL
5	LICENSE PLATES FOR FIREFIGHTERS AND AMBULANCE PERSONNEL;
6	ALLOCATING PART OF THE LICENSE FEES TO THE FIRE SERVICES
7	TRAINING SCHOOL AND PART OF THE LICENSE FEES TO THE
8	DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND ENVIRONMENTAL SCIENCES; AMENDING
9	SECTIONS 61-3-332 AND 61-3-446, MCA; AND PROVIDING A DELAYED
10	EFFECTIVE DATE."

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12 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

Section 1. Section 61-3-332, MCA, is amended to read: 13 "61-3-332. (Temporary) Number plates. (1) A motor 14 vehicle that is driven upon the streets or highways of 15 Montana must display both front and rear number plates, 16 17 bearing the distinctive number assigned the vehicle. The 18 number plates are in 10 series: one series for owners of 19 motorcars, one for owners of motor vehicles of the motorcycle or quadricycle type, one for trailers, one for 20 21 trucks, one for dealers in vehicles of the motorcycle or guadricycle type that bear the distinctive letters "MCD" or 22 the letters "MC" and the word "DEALER", one for franchised 23 dealers in new motorcars (including trucks and trailers) or 24 25 new and used motorcars (including trucks and trailers) that

1 bear the distinctive letter "D" or the word "DEALER", one 2 for dealers in used motorcars only (including used trucks and trailers) that bear the distinctive letters "UD" or the З 4 letter "U" and the word "DEALER", one for dealers in 5 trailers and/or semitrailers (new or used) that bear the distinctive letters "DTR" or the letters "TR" and the word 6 "DEALER", one for dealers in recreational vehicles that bear 7 8 the distinctive letters "RV" or the letter "R" and the word 9 "DEALER", and one for special license plates. All markings 10 for the various kinds of dealers' plates must be placed on 11 the number plates assigned thereto in the position that the 12 department designates.

13 (2) All number plates for motor vehicles must be issued
14 for a minimum period of 4 years, bear a distinctive marking,
15 and be furnished by the state. In years when number plates
16 are not issued, the department shall provide nonremovable
17 stickers bearing appropriate registration numbers that must
18 be affixed to the license plates in use.

19 (3) Subject to the provisions of this section, the 20 department shall create a new design for number plates as 21 provided in this section₇-and-it-shall-manufacture-the-newly 22 designed--number--plates-for-issuance-after-danuary-17-19917 23 to-replace₇-at-renewal-as-required-in-61-3-312-and-61-3-3147 24 number-plates-that-were-displayed-on-motor--vehicles--before 25 that-date.

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(4) In the case of motorcars and trucks, plates must be 1 of metal 6 inches wide and 12 inches in length. The outline 2 of the state of Montana must be used as a distinctive border 3 on such the license plates, and the word "Montana" and the 4 year must be placed across the plates. Such-registration 5 Registration plates must be treated with a reflectorized 6 background material according to specifications prescribed 7 8 by the department.

(5) The distinctive registration numbers must begin 9 with a number one or with a letter-number combination, such 10 as "A 1" or "AA 1", or any other similar combination of 11 letters and numbers. The distinctive registration number or 12 letter-number combination assigned to the vehicle must 13 appear on the plate preceded by the number of the county and 14 appearing in horizontal order on the same horizontal 15 baseline. The county number must be separated from the 16 distinctive registration number by a separation mark unless 17 a letter-number combination is used. The dimensions of such 18 numerals and letters must be determined by the department, 19 and all county and registration numbers must be of equal 20 21 height.

22 (6) For the use of tax-exempt motor vehicles, in
23 addition to the markings provided in this section, number
24 plates must bear the following distinctive markings:

25 (a) For vehicles owned by the state, the department may

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1 designate the prefix number for the various state
2 departments. All numbered plates issued to state departments
3 must bear the words "State Owned", and no a year number may
4 not be indicated thereon on the plates because these
5 numbered plates are of a permanent nature and will be
6 replaced by the department only when the physical condition
7 of numbered plates requires it.

8 (b) For vehicles that are owned by the counties, 9 municipalities, irrigation districts organized under the 10 laws of Montana and not operating for profit, and school districts and that are used and operated by officials and 11 12 employees thereof in line of duty and for vehicles on loan 13 from the United States government or the state of Montana 14 to, or owned by, the civil air patrol and used and operated 15 by officials and employees thereof in the line of duty, 16 there must be placed on the number plates assigned thereto. 17 in a position that the department may designate, the letter "X" or the word "EXEMPT". Distinctive registration numbers 18 19 for plates assigned to motor vehicles of each of the 20 counties in the state and those of the municipalities and 21 school districts situated within each of the counties and 22 those of the irrigation districts that obtain plates within 23 each county must begin with number one and be numbered consecutively. Because these number plates are of a 24 25 permanent nature, they are subject to replacement by the

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department only when the physical condition of the number
 plates requires it and a year number may not be displayed on
 the number plates.

4 (7) On all number plates assigned to motor vehicles of the truck and trailer type, other than tax-exempt trucks and 5 tax-exempt trailers, there must appear the letter "T" or the 6 7 word "TRUCK" on plates assigned to trucks and the letters 8 "TR" or the word "TRAILER" on plates assigned to trailers 9 and housetrailers. The letters "MC" or the word "CYCLE" must 10 appear on plates assigned to vehicles of the motorcycle or 11 quadricycle type.

12 (8) Number plates issued to a passenger car, truck,
13 trailer, or vehicle of the motorcycle or quadricycle type
14 may be transferred only to a replacement passenger car,
15 truck, trailer, or motorcycle- or quadricycle-type vehicle.
16 No <u>A</u> registration or license fee may <u>not</u> be assessed upon a
17 transfer of a number plate under 61-3-317 and 61-3-335.

Any new counties must be assigned numbers 8 by the department as they may be formed, beginning with the 9 10 number 57.

(10) Each type of special license plate approved by the 11 12 legislature, except collegiate license plates authorized in 13 61-3-463, must be a separate series of plates, numbered as 14 provided in subsection (5), except that the county number must be replaced by a nonremovable design or decal 15 16 designating the group or organization to which the applicant belongs. Unless otherwise specifically stated in 17 this 18 section, the special plates are subject to the same rules and laws as govern the issuance of regular license plates, 19 20 must be placed or mounted on a vehicle owned by the person who is eligible to receive them, and must be removed upon 21 sale or other disposition of the vehicle. The special 22 23 license plates must be issued to national guard members, 24 former prisoners of war, handicapped persons, reservists, disabled veterans, survivors of the Pearl Harbor attack, 25

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veterans of the armed services, or veterans of the armed
 services who were awarded the purple heart medal, active or
 <u>retired firefighters, or ambulance personnel</u> who comply with
 the following provisions:

(a) An active member of the Montana national guard may 5 be issued a special license plate with a design or decal 6 7 displaying the letters "NG". The adjutant general shall 8 issue to each active member of the Montana national guard a certificate authorizing the department to issue one set of 9 national guard plates, and the member shall surrender the 10 plates to the department upon becoming ineligible to use 11 12 them.

13 (b) An active member of the reserve armed forces of the United States of America who is a resident of this state may 14 be issued a special license plate with a design or decal 15 16 displaying the following: United States army reserve, AR 17 (symbol): United States naval reserve, NR (anchor): United 18 States air force reserve, AFR (symbol); and United States 19 marine corps reserve, MCR (globe and anchor). The commanding 20 officer of each armed forces reserve unit shall issue to 21 each eligible member of the reserve unit a certificate 22 authorizing the issuance of one set of plates. The member 23 shall surrender the plates to the department upon becoming 24 ineligible to use them.

25 (c) A resident of Montana who is a veteran of the armed

forces of the United States and who is 100% disabled because of an injury that has been determined by the department of veterans affairs to be service-connected may, upon presentation to the department of proof of the 100% disability, be issued a special license plate under this section with a design or decal displaying the letters "DV".

7 (i) The fee for original or renewal registration by a
8 100% disabled veteran for a passenger vehicle or a truck
9 with a GVW-rated capacity of 1 ton or less is \$5 and is in
10 lieu of all other fees and taxes for that vehicle under this
11 chapter.

12 (ii) Special license plates issued to a disabled veteran13 are not transferable to another person.

14 (iii) A disabled veteran is not entitled to a special
15 license plate for more than one vehicle.

(iv) A vehicle lawfully displaying a disabled veteran's
plate and that is conveying a 100% disabled veteran is
entitled to the parking privileges allowed a handicapped
person's vehicle under this title.

(d) A Montana resident who is a veteran of the armed
forces of the United States and was captured and held
prisoner by a military force of a foreign nation, documented
by his the veteran's service record, may upon application
and presentation of proof be issued a special license plate
with a design or decal displaying the words "ex-prisoner of

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war" or an abbreviation the department considers
 appropriate.

(e) Upon payment of all taxes and fees required by 3 parts 3 and 5 of this chapter and upon furnishing proof 4 satisfactory to the department that the applicant meets the 5 requirements of this subsection (e), the department shall 6 issue to a Montana resident who is a veteran of the armed 7 services of the United States special license plates, for 8 one motor vehicle only, designed to indicate that the 9 10 applicant is a survivor of the Pearl Harbor attack if the 11 applicant was a member of the United States armed forces on 12 December 7, 1941, was on station on December 7, 1941, during 13 the hours of 7:55 a.m. to 9:45 a.m. (Hawaii time) at Pearl 14 Harbor, the island of Oahu, or offshore at a distance of not 15 more than 3 miles, and received an honorable discharge from 16 the United States armed forces. If special license plates 17 issued under this subsection are lost, stolen, or mutilated, 18 the recipient of the plates is entitled to replacement plates upon request and without charge. 19

20 (f) A motor vehicle owner and resident of this state 21 who is a veteran of the armed services of the United States 22 may be issued license plates inscribed as provided in 23 subsection (10)(f)(i) if he the person was separated from 24 the armed services under other than dishonorable 25 circumstances or was awarded the purple heart medal; (i) Upon submission of proof, in a form prescribed by
 the department, of his the person's qualification under this
 subsection, there must be issued to each applicant, in lieu
 of the regular license plates prescribed by law, special
 license plates numbered in sets of two with a different
 number on each set. The plates must display:

7 (A) the word "VETERAN" and a symbol signifying the 8 United States army, United States navy, United States air 9 force, United States marine corps, or United States coast 10 guard, according to the record of service verified in the 11 application; or

(B) a symbol representing the purple heart medal.

(ii) Plates must be furnished by the department to the county treasurer, who shall issue them to qualified veterans. The plates must be placed or mounted on the vehicle owned by the veteran designated in the application and must be removed upon sale or other disposition of the vehicle.

(iii) Each veteran who receives special license plates under this subsection (10)(f) is liable for payment of all taxes and fees required under parts 3 and 4 of this chapter and a special veteran's or purple heart medal license plate fee of \$10. Upon an original application for a license under this subsection (10)(f), the county treasurer shall: (A) deposit \$3 of the special fee in the county general

<u>DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION</u>: An act creating special license plates for firefighters and ambulance personnel and allocating part of the license fees to the Fire Services Training School and part of the license fees to the Department of Health and Environmental Sciences.

ASSUMPTIONS:

Department of Justice

- There are 8,000 active and retired firefighters and 2,000 active and retired ambulance personnel currently in Montana. Half of those eligible will purchase special plates, or 5,000. Because the effective date is 1/1/94, half (2,500) will purchase in FY94 and half (2,500) in FY95.
- 2. Start up expenditures of the Department of Justice during FY94 will be design costs of \$2,000 and 150 hours of computer programming, costing \$5,700. In addition postage and handling will cost \$5 per set of plates (\$5 X 2,500 = \$12,500 each year).

Fire Services Training School

- 3. Matching grants will be provided to local fire services for the development of training programs and facilities. It is assumed that 90% of the annual revenue from this special fee (\$8 per plate X 2,000 = \$16,000) will be granted to local fire services.
- 4. Additional administrative costs incurred by the Fire Services Training School will be funded by revenue appropriated from the state special revenue account. It is estimated that 10% of the revenue from this special fee will be used for increased operating expenses.

Department of Health and Environmental Sciences

5. Special fees and corresponding expenditures under this bill will involve the Health Services and Medical Facilities Program. It is estimated that annual special revenue from the license plate fee will be \$4,000 (\$8 X 500). Department of Corrections and Human Services

6. There will be minimal increased expenditures incurred in the production of these special license plates.
