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BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA: 9

Section 1. Section 13-35-225, MCA, is amended to read: 10 "13-35-225. Election materials not to be anonymous. (1) 11 Whenever a person makes an expenditure for the purpose of 12 13 financing communications advocating the success or defeat of 14 a candidate, political party, or ballot issue through any 15 broadcasting station, newspaper, magazine. outdoor 16 advertising facility, direct mailing, poster, handbill, 17 bumper sticker, or other form of general political 18 advertising, the communication nust clearly and 19 conspicuously state the name and address of the person who 20 made or financed the expenditure for the communication, 21 including in the case of a political committee, the name and 22 address of the treasurer. Communications--in--a-partisan 23 election-financed-by-a-candidate-or--a-political--committee 24 organized---on---the---candidate's--behalf--must--state--the 25 candidate-s-party-affiliation-or-include-the-party-symbol:

1 (2) If a document or other article of advertising is 2 too small for the requirements of subsection (1) to be 3 conveniently included, the person financing the 4 communication shall file a copy of the article with the commissioner, together with the required information, prior 5 6 to its public distribution.

7 (3) If information required in subsection (1) is inadvertently omitted or not printed, upon discovering the 8 9 omission, the person financing the communication shall file 10 notification of the omission with the commissioner within 5 11 days and make every reasonable effort to bring the material 12 into compliance with subsection (1)."
